3 die while working in septic tank



Find solution to caretaker system row

Germany, EU urge govt, opposition to avoid politics of blockade

Visiting German and European Union leaders yesterday said the government and the opposition in Bangladesh should work out a solution over the caretaker government dispute and avoid politics of blockade.

German Federal Minister for Economic Cooperation and Development Dirk Niebel and EU Commissioner for Development Andris Piebalgs came up with the identical views at a press conference organised to wrapping up their four-day visit to Bangladesh.

They also said the EU and Germany want to see free, fair and inclusive Bangladesh national elections in 2014.

EU Commissioner Andris Piebalgs said there are divergent views on a caretaker government overseeing the next elections, but the political parties have obligation to work together in the interest of the country's econ-

Govt to take up \$6.45b connectivity projects

ADB gives \$23m technical assistance loan



The government has planned to construct and upgrade 2,000 kilometres of land transport network to boost cross-border trade and establish greater connectivity across South Asia.

A total of 22 projects including eight for railway have already been chalked out under the proposed Sub-Regional

Transport Project Preparatory Facility. Of them, projects covering about 300-km network will be ready for implementation by 2012 while the rest by 2013.

The government yesterday entered a \$23 million technical assistance loan agreement with the Asian Development Bank paving the way for taking up the **SEE PAGE 19 COL 5**

Finance asked to take steps

Agriculture Minister Matia Chowdhury and Awami League lawmaker Tofail Ahmed yesterday in parliament said the present government cannot avoid its responsibility for the sharemarket debacle and the finance ministry should take proper measures to this end.

Mentioning that many investors lost most of their capital due to the debacle, they demanded the government give special attention and take all necessary steps to stabilise the market.

Joining the discussion on the proposed budget for the 2011-12 fiscal year, Matia said the government should take the responsibility for the debacle.

"The government is made responsible for any human casualty even in different incidents, therefore, it [government] cannot avoid the responsibility of such a big incident," observed the minister.
