# JS body devises new polls formula

No JS session in 90-day poll period; consensus needed on 'interim govt' to hold elections

The parliamentary standing committee on law ministry yesterday decided to propose bringing a change to the constitution to limit the functions of a parliament during the last three months of its tenure and to hold the general election within the period.

But it may not make any proposal right now to restrict the government's power during the time as it wants to fix the matter in consultation with the main opposition BNP, committee sources said.

The constitution amendment bill placed in the Jatiya Sangsad on Saturday, too, envisaged holding the parliamentary polls within the 90 days to the dissolution


of the outgoing parliament. The constitution of 1972 had the same provision.


