### Ganatantri Party against increase in poll expenses

Ganatantri Party yesterday suggested the Election Commission does not increase the deposit money from existing Tk 10,000 and poll expenditure from existing Tk 15 lakh for each candidate in the parliamentary elections to stop misuse of money.

The EC's proposal, however, is that the deposit money should be increased to Tk 30,000 and the poll expenditure to Tk 25 lakh for electoral campaign.

At a dialogue with the commission, the party leaders also recommended phased introduction of electronic voting machine (EVM) and launching of mass campaign to make the people aware of the new technology.

A six-member delegation led by Ganatantri Party President Mohammad Afzal attended the dialogue at EC secretariat in the city yesterday.

The EC on June 7 launched dialogues with the political parties on issues like RPO, demarcation of constituencies, appointment of election commissioners, and use of EVM.

Nurur Rahman Selim, general secretary of the party, suggested inclusion of National Human Rights Commission chairman in the EC-proposed search committee to appoint EC member.

Their other recommendations include declaring loan defaulters and bill defaulters disqualified for participating in the election and providing tools for election campaign instead of cash by the commission.

## No polls in student unions ail national politics: Quader

Awami League Presidium Member Obaidul Quader yesterday said absence of elections in student unions at educational institutions is responsible for the ailing condition of national politics.

Addressing the council of Dhaka University (DU) unit of Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) as the chief guest in the city's Institution of Engineers, Bangladesh, Quader said student politics produces leaders of national politics.

Quader, also former BCL president, stressed the need for involving meritorious students in student politics to improve its quality.

On criticism about misdeeds by a section of BCL leaders and activists, he said, "We cannot deny the misdeeds of leaders and activists, though it is not the student front or associate body of Awami League."

He said what is currently occurring in the name of student politics is nothing but "hybrid politics mixed with formalin".

Quader, assigned by Awami League President Sheikh Hasina to oversee the upcoming council of BCL scheduled for July 10-11, said the process of selecting new leaders would be transparent.

On the main opposition BNP's movement, he said, "Nothing can be achieved by announcing negative movement like hartal."

BCL General Secretary Mahfujul Haider Chowdhury Roton called upon the leaders and activists to resist the strike called by Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) at DU for July 2-3.

## Tk 139.24 crore BOU budget

Bangladesh Open University has announced its budget amounting to Tk 139 crore 24 lakh 17 thousands for the 2011-2012 financial year of which Tk 108 crore 24 lakh 17 thousands in revenue head and Tk 31 crore in development head.

Bangladesh University Grants Commission (UGC) will provide Tk 21 crore 88 lakh as government grant which is 20.21% in the revenue budget. Taka 86 crore and 36 lakh has been financed from BOU's own source which is 79.78% of the revenue budget.

# 100 hoardings

Two enforcement teams of Rajdhani Unnayan Kartripakkha (Rajuk) yesterday pulled down over 100 hoardings of around 25 illegal housing projects in Dumni and Patira areas near Khilkhet and in Keraniganj on the outskirts of the capital.

A team led by executive magistrate of Rajuk Rokon-ud-Doula knocked down 90 signboards and billboards of eight housing projects from Dumni to Patira area.

Another team led by executive magistrate of Rajuk Shahidul Islam Bhuiyan also pulled down around 20 signboards and billboards of seven housing projects at South Keraniganj.

An HC bench on June 8 directed the government to stop developing 77 unauthorised housing projects in and around Dhaka within 30 days and Rajuk is taking action against those projects since last week.

These illegal realtors had been implementing their projects violating the Wetland Protection Act, 2000 and rules for land development. The illegal projects at Dumni and Patira are Bhuluwa Royal

City, Jamuna City, Baridhara River View City, Ashalay,

Bashukunja Abashik Prokolpo, Swarnali Housing and Purbachal Lotus Valley. The projects at South Keraniganj area include Shwapno Dhara Model Town, Ruposhi Bangla Model Town, Destiny

City, Bhuiya Abashik Elaka, M Model Town, Al Mujahid Bahumukhi Samobay Samity and Buriganga Housing Ltd. Among others, authorised officers of Rajuk Md Shafiqul Islam and Md Parvez Khadem and deputy directors of town planning Sirajul Islam and Ashraful Islam took part in the

drive of two mobile courts. The Rajuk during the seven-day drive have so far knocked down over 300 hoardings and signboards of over 100 housing projects.

duction sharing contract with ConocoPhillips for oil and gas exploration from two deep-sea blocks in the Bay of Bengal in efforts to meet the rising energy demand.

The deep-sea blocks DS-08-10 and DS-08-11 cover an area of 5,158 square km and are located about 280 km from the port city of Chittagong.

### Truck helper dies in fall
