It's a plot against Zia family Says BNP

BNP acting Secretary General Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir has condemned and protested submission of supplementary charge sheets implicating party leaders Tarique Rahman and Lutfozzaman Babar in the August 21 grenade attack cases.

Tarique faces 14 cases

Tarique Rahman, who has been accused in the August 21 grenade attack case, came into political limelight when he was promoted to BNP leadership as the senior joint secretary general during BNP-led four-party alliance regime in 2002.

Tarique, son of late president Ziaur Rahman and former premier Khaleda Zia, soon became one of the most powerful persons in the country and attracted tremendous

Tarique Rahman, Lutfozzaman Babar, Harris Chowdhury and Ali Ahsan Mohammad Mojaheed are among the 30 more people charge-sheeted yesterday in the August 21 grenade attack cases.

Hawa Bhaban, former political office of BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia, different militant organisations and the then administration had collaborated in planning and staging the grisly blasts at an

Awami League rally in the capital in 2004, Metropolitan Public Prosecutor Abdullah Abu said quoting the charges.

The attack, which killed 24 leaders and workers and injured around 300 others including the then opposition leader Sheikh Hasina, was carried out to eliminate the AL leadership. The anti-liberation forces had plotted it over a long time, he added.

The PP was talking to reporters after the Criminal Investigation Department sub-

mitted the supplementary charge sheets to the Chief Metropolitan Magistrate's Court in Dhaka in the afternoon.

Replying to a query, he said Tarique Rahman, senior vice-chairman of BNP and elder son of party Chairperson Khaleda Zia, was one of the masterminds behind the attack.

During the last BNP-Jamaat rule, when the attack took place, Tarique used to control Hawa Bhaban, which was widely considered an alternative power

centre. Harris was political secretary to the then prime minister Khaleda; Babar was state minister for home; and Jamaat-e-Islami Secretary General Mojaheed was social welfare minister.

The Daily Star on October 27, 2009, ran an investigative report, headlined 'It was Hawa Bhaban Plot', about the people behind planning and staging the attack.

The metropolitan PP said Hawa Bhaban and the then administration

MONEY LAUNDERING Hearing on Tarique's case deferred

A Dhaka court yesterday deferred until July 25 the hearing on the charge framing against Tarique Rahman, senior vice chairman of BNP, and his business partner Giasuddin Al Mamun in a money laundering case.

Judge Mohammad Mozammel Hossain of the Special Judge's Court-3 passed the order following a petition submitted by the defendants' lawyer, barrister Mahbub Uddin Khokon, seeking an adjournment of the hearing.

Hartals, weekend make 6-day 'vacation'

BNP, allies call 48-hr hartal July 6-7, followed by 2-day weekend, 12 parties' 30-hr hartal

The BNP-led opposition and 12 other parties have called for 78-hour country-wide hartals in two phases, which will virtually put the country on a six-day "vacation" from July 6.

In the first phase, BNP and its three allies will enforce a 48-hour shutdown on Wednesday and Thursday in protest against scrapping of the caretaker government system and "hurting" the religious sentiment of the people through the 15th amendment to the constitution.

BNP and Jamaat-e-Islami announced the hartal through separate press confer-

ences at their party offices in the capital yesterday.

The four-party alliance's hartal will be followed by Friday and Saturday -- two weekly holidays.

An alliance of 12 parties led by Bangladesh Khelafat Majlish will then enforce a 30-hour shutdown from Sunday morning till 12:00noon of Monday.

The alliance, comprised of mostly Islamist parties, announced the hartal on June 30 in protest of dropping the phrase "absolute faith in Allah" from the country's charter.

Shun hartal to avert confrontation

Ashraf asks BNP

"There is no alternative to talks. When dialogue is closed, confrontation is imminent. But the people of Bangladesh do not want conflict, nor do we," he told reporters yesterday.

Thaksin allies win Thai election

Allies of Thailand's fugitive ex-leader Thaksin Shinawatra stormed to victory in elections yesterday, in a remarkable comeback after years of turmoil sparked by his ouster in a military coup.

Prime Minister Abhisit Vejjajiva conceded defeat and congratulated a victorious opposition led by Thaksin's youngest sister, Yingluck Shinawatra, who is now set to become Thailand first female premier.

With 92 percent of votes counted, Puea Thai had won 260 seats out of 500, well ahead of the Democrats with 163, according to the Election Commission.

"The outcome is clear -- Puea Thai has won the
