On the occasion of poet Sufia Kamal's birth centenary, non-government organisation Steps Towards Development arranged a two-day programme at Chhayanaut Sangskriti Bhaban, Dharmondi, Dhaka on July 3 and 4.

The programme featured live music, screening of a documentary on the life of the poet, discussion and a photo exhibition.

Law Minister Barrister Shafiq Ahmed was the chief guest at the inaugural programme.

At the first day's programme, artistes Nasima Shaheen and

Mizanur Rahman rendered songs, while members of the cultural organisation Jionkathi recited poems of Sufia Kamal.

The photo exhibition, held on the second floor of the building, featured some rare photographs of the poet.

A discussion and screening of the documentary were held on the second day. The discussion featured State Minister for Women and Children's Affairs Dr. Shirin Sharmin Chowdhury as the chief guest.

Professor AAMS Arefin Siddique, vice chancellor, Dhaka University; music exponent and Chhayanaut president Dr. Sanjida Khatun and Sufia Kamal's daughter, human rights activist Sultana Kamal were

special guests. Among others, Professor Momtaz Begum, chairperson, National Women's Organisation and Ranjan Karmakar, executive director of Steps, spoke at the discussion.

The discussants highlighted Sufia Kamal's immense contribution to the nation, and urged everyone to follow her in her footsteps to work for a better society.

The documentary, titled "Aparajita", was screened after the discussion. The nearly 40-minute long documentary has been directed by Manzar-e Hasin Murad. DVD of the documentary was also launched on the day. Attending guests unveiled the cover-jacket of the film.

Branching out and reaching the fans

In conversation with Kona

Popular singer Kona has branched out in acting and TV show hosting. Her voice has earned wide recognition thanks to several jingles.

Kona's last album was released two years ago. The self-titled album was her second solo record. The track "Boroshha" was an overnight hit and held its position on the top chart for a while. After a hiatus, Kona is busy again with her third studio album -- couple of songs have already been recorded. Expectations surrounding the album run high, as three juggernaut composers Bappa Majumdar, Habib and Fuad are involved with the album. Bappa will do the bulk of the work -- composing tunes for six songs, while Fuad and Habib will compose three and one respectively. Kona informs that although 70 percent of the job has been completed, the name of the album is yet to be decided. She adds that the album may come out this month. Listeners will get a variety of classical inspired, romantic and semi-rock tunes, along with the first ever collaboration between Kona and Habib.

Apart from her new album, Kona's schedule is marked with live performances, playbacks and jingles. Her voice will soon be heard in songs of the movies "Chheleti", "Lal Tip" and "Speed". Kona also sang for the new Banglalink ad. Her recent work also includes the title song for the TV serial "Terminal", written by Jahid Akbar.

Audience first heard Kona's voice in her debut album "Jyamtik Bhalobasha" in 2006. The same year she began acting and hosting a show "Amra Ekhon Unish Kuri" (on ntv) and "Tomader Pelo Bangladesh". The hosting experience was a wonderful one, says Kona. Her first TV play was "Nokol Poshak", directed by Shahiduzzaman Selim. Although the initial plan was to appear in one play, praises came as inspiration to venture further into the acting world, Kona informs. The acting journey has seen Kona appearing in 26 productions so far, counting both single-episode plays and serials, the most popular of which are "Danguli", "Bhober Haat", "Chhayabithi-Toley", "Bohemian", "Society", "Bhoy", "Hojoborolo" etc.

Kona had her music lessons from Nazrul Academy and Shishu Academy. The teacher and mentor who groomed her vocal talents is Moidul Islam, says Kona.

Kona's career in jingles began in 1998 with a tune composed by Emon Saha. In 2003, she joined a female group Angel Four, which included singers Tisha, Rumana and Nafisa.

Kona says that the love of the audience is her main gain. A memorable experience: When she was busy with playbacks for movies "Amar Achhe Jol", "The Search" and "Jaago", Kona received a surprise call from seasoned singer Shakila Zafar. Zafar called just to express her appreciation of Kona's singing.

All of Kona's dreams surround music as it means the world to her. She feels that live performances on stage are a completely unique experience. Although of late the number of live shows have gone down, Kona says she was up to the neck with around 14 shows a month until recently.

Doors mark Morrison's death anniversary

Former members of The Doors have marked the 40th anniversary of Jim Morrison's death in Paris.

On Sunday, keyboardist Ray Manzarek and guitarist Robby Krieger lit candles at Morrison's grave in the city's Pere Lachaise cemetery.

Morrison, the band's lead singer, died of heart failure in a bath in Paris on July 2, 1971. He was 27.

Hundreds of Morrison fans, some wearing T-shirts bearing the words 40th Anniversary, left flowers at the grave.

Some sang and others read poems to mark the day.

Morrison moved to Paris in 1971 to write.

He was found dead in the bath by his girlfriend, Pamela Courson. A doctor's report stated the cause of death was heart failure aggravated by heavy drinking.

Morrison, the son of a US Navy admiral, was born in 1943 in Florida.

He formed The Doors with Manzarek in 1965 in Los Angeles

The band name was inspired by Aldous Huxley's "The Doors of Perception".

When it comes to lending his face for a cause, Bollywood superstar Aamir Khan is always ahead of other actors.

Aamir has not only made quite a few movies like "Taare Zameen Par", "3 Idiots" and "Hum Hain Raahi Pyar Ke" that deal with children's issues but also appeared for the government of India's promotional video on tourism asking Indians to behave properly in order to not put off foreign tourists and keep places of tourism interest clean.

And now the actor is all set to don a different role -- that of brand ambassador for the Ministry of Women and Child Development for spreading the message of curbing malnutrition among children.

Aamir held a meeting with Minister of State for Women and Child Development Krishna Tirath here on Monday along with his creative team led by lyricist Prasoon Joshi, making a presentation on how he plans to spearhead the campaign on generating awareness among people about ill effects of malnutrition.

Tirath, a lawmaker from Delhi, expressed happiness that Aamir is ready to shoulder this social responsibility without expecting anything in return. She thanked Aamir for sharing the government's concern for children and making this sincere effort in spreading the social message about the scourge of malnutrition and good food habits among children and mothers.

Aamir, for his part, said, "To be involved with this campaign is an important part of my emotional aspect. It's an attempt to reach out not just to the common man but to policymakers,



administrators and the media as all of us have important and different roles to play."

"As an actor, my job is to entertain the more than 1.2 billion people of India but as a citizen of this country, I'm sensitive to a lot of issues. As my commitment to children is very high, I want to contribute as much as I can," he added.

Explaining the decision to choose Aamir as the brand ambassador against malnutrition, a senior ministry official said, "Aamir has been involved in societal causes for long. When we approached him, we found him very forthcoming."

The 138th death anniversary of poet Michael Madhusudan Dutt was observed here recently in a fitting manner. Michael Madhusudan Sahitya Parishad organised programmes that included a discussion, recitation and cultural events.

The discussion was held at Sathkira Press Club auditorium with Sahitya Parishad president Tripti Mohon Mallik in the chair.

British singer-musician Sting cancelled a concert he was due to give in Kazakhstan's capital Astana on Monday, blaming violations of the human rights of striking oil workers in the ex-Soviet state.

Sting said in a statement published on his website that he cancelled the concert, part of his Symphonichy world tour, after campaign group Amnesty International told him of repressions against oil and gas workers.

"Hunger strikes, imprisoned workers and tens of thousands on strike represents a virtual picket line which I have no intention of crossing," Sting was quoted as saying in the statement late Sunday.

Sting was due to perform songs from his days as leader of band The Police as well as his solo hits with a symphony orchestra

backing as part of city day celebrations, with tickets selling for up to 10000 tenge (\$690).

The Kazakh organisers initially said Sunday that Sting's concert had been cancelled for "organisational and technical reasons".

Several hundred oil and gas workers went on strike in May in the Mangistau region on the shores of the Caspian Sea demanding higher wages, picketing the regional administration and attempting to close off highways.

Police detained strikers for taking part in an unsanctioned protest and several dozen people were sacked.

Sting, known for his espousal of environmental causes, has been criticised for giving a concert in Tashkent in 2009 organised by the daughter of Uzbek President Islam Karimov, criticised for human rights abuses.
