## EC invites BNP for talks again


The CEC was talking to reporters at the commission's secretariat over the ongoing dialogue being held with registered political parties.

# ADB boost for primary education

The Asian Development Bank (ADB) is extending a \$320 million loan to help Bangladesh continue its attempt to improve quality of primary education system, increase student enrolment and achieve gender parity.

ADB Board of Directors approved the fund in Manila yesterday for implementation of the Third Primary Education Development Project, said a press release.

The ministry of primary and mass education will execute the project which is expected to be completed by June 2016.

"Bangladesh has been successful in improving access to education, including being one of the early achievers of gender parity up to the secondary level.

"Despite, primary schools still suffer from high student dropout rates, as well as low completion levels and significant student and teacher absenteeism. This project will help address these issues," said Sultan H Rahman, ADB director general at the South Asia Department.

The project will support textbook and curriculum improvements, a teacher development plan and a class
