The planned border haats, common marketplaces for both Bangladeshis and Indians, are likely to open officially this month to boost local business and trade between the two neighbours, the commerce minister said yesterday.

"Things have now been finally settled. Border haats will be formally opened within this month", Faruk Khan told the news agency over phone. The minister said he would for-

mally open the haats along with

Indian Commerce and Industries

Minister Anand Sharma. Faruk Khan, however, did not specify the date. The border haats plan remained unimplemented although over 18 months have passed since the two

Several deadlines mentioned by the government for opening the haats have already expired, with the last such deadline being March 2011. Bureaucratic tangles in both the countries have been blamed for the long delay in opening the border haats.

Initially, the border haats will be opened in Sonarhat-Lyngkhat (Sylhet-East Khasi Hills border), Baliamari-Kalaichar (Kurigram-West Garo Hills border), and Narayantala-Balat (Sunamganj-East Khasi Hills border).

Both countries have plan to open up at least 10 more haats in the future to revive the historic trade ties between Bangladesh and India, according to the ministry sources. The two countries agreed to set up

the border haats along their international boundary in the northeast when Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina visited India in January last year.



Failure of ruling Awami League (AL) backed candidates to gain majority in the just concluded Union Parishad (UP) elections in Rajshahi was mainly due to ignorance of AL lawmakers to consider grassroots opinion in selecting the candidates, said party insiders. Some AL leaders alleged it was only

money, handed to the lawmakers, that was considered in giving the nominations.

Though the elections were not between the political parties, the majority of the chairman candidates were selected by the par-

Out of 62 UP chairmen posts, pro-BNP candidates bagged the highest 40 seats while AL won 18 seats, Jamaat-e-Islami got three and an individual candidate won the last.

The district unit AL President Tajul Islam M Faruk described the failure as "normal

and expected", though AL won all six parliamentary seats two and a half years back in Rajshahi, known as the safe vote bank of BNP for long.

"Party lawmakers and their men nomi-

nated most of the candidates according to their whim, not following the political system of hearing from the grassroots," he said, adding that there were some allegations of

> handing out bribes for nominations. The district BNP

President Nadim Mostafa said BNP would have won 20 percent more seats if AL had not occupied the vote centres, created obstacles and threatened voters in some unions.

Corruption in relief distribution and "work for money projects" by AL also contributed to their failure, he said, adding, "It is a silent signal for the ruling party and it shows the government's position among the rural people."
