



No hope for left eye

Doctors say after surgery on Rumana

Dhaka University teacher Rumana Manzur will never regain her vision in the left eye, said ophthalmologists of Vancouver General Hospital in Canada after conducting a surgery on Tuesday.

The eye-specialists have decided to operate on her right eye tomorrow, said Rashed Maqsood, a cousin of Rumana.

"After the hours-long surgery, eye-experts informed Rumana and her father that the optic nerve of her left eye became dysfunctional

Waste treatment plants kept shut 6 factories fined

The Department of Environment (DoE) yesterday fined six factories around Tk 1 crore for discharging untreated liquid waste into the river Turag in Gazipur.

The factories are Delta Dyeing Ltd, Mallik Fabrics Ltd, Moontex Fabrics Ltd, Keya Knit Composite Ltd, Jara Knit Composite Ltd and Convince Dyeing Ltd.

The DoE team also found that almost all the factories were running their operation keeping the Effluent Treatment Plants (ETP) idle, said Mohammad Munir Chowdhury, director of DoE, who led the enforcement team.

"We were shocked to find how they were destroying the environment with toxic chemicals keeping the ETPs idle at the factories," said Munir.

The team also ordered the closure of operation of Mallik Fabrics for not installing an ETP.

The drive was conducted in Kashimpur, West Shailadubi, Surabari, Nayapara and Jarun areas from 6:00am to 1:00pm.

An environmental disaster is imminent in the localities as a result of such mindless release of untreated chemical effluents into canals that lead to the Turag, Munir told The Daily Star.

The DoE stopped operation of two other dyeing factories in Savar on Tuesday and fined them around Tk 65 lakh for discharging untreated effluent into the Dhaleshwari and Bangshi rivers.

Power-cut alert for Ramadan Ministry calls for austerity

UNB, Dhaka

Power consumers are likely to face 500-700 megawatt load shedding during Ramadan although around 1,000 MW power was added to the national grid in the last one year.

Considering the shortage, the Power and Energy Ministry yesterday urged people to maintain austerity in consuming electricity and gas during the holy month beginning on August 2.

It said the power generation is expected to remain within 5,000 MW against the demand for 6,000-6,200 MW.

AMNESTY TO ILLEGAL WORKERS

KL to regularise now from Aug 1

Malaysia has set August 1 as the new date for registration of undocumented foreign workers for regularisation.

The exercise supposed to have begun on July 11 was postponed for registration of around 1.8 million legal foreign workers in the country from July 13 to 31, Malaysian newspaper The Star reported yesterday.

On June 22, Kuala Lumpur announced amnesty to irregular foreign workers, allowing them to get registered for regularisation or return home without facing any penalty.

There are around five lakh Bangladeshi workers in Malaysia with an estimated three lakh of them undocumented.
