

On his 69th birth anniversary, late theatre icon Abdullah Al Mamun was remen bered by his troupe Theatre with a threeday celebration programme held at Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy. The programme was inaugurated on July 13 at the Studio Theatre Hall of the academy. The first day's programme featured a memorial lecture named after Mamun staging of the play "Meraj Fakir-er Ma" and opening of a photo exhibition.

Recalling Mamun's talents in diverse sectors of arts and culture, his lifelong friend and ITI Worldwide president Ramendu Majumdar termed him as an 'artiste of multi-talents'.

Abdullah Al Mamun was one of the architects who helped Bangladeshi theatre attain its current position. His contri-

bution in the sphere of TV plays was enormous and he pioneered the mega serial in Bangladesh. Mamun also showcased his talent in cinema by directing film such as 'Shareng Bou',"

said Majumdar, also chief of Theatre Majumdar asserted that his troupe will hold a colourful festival next year to celebrate the 70th anniversary of the late theatre personality.





Nasreen is the former chairperson of the Department of Philosophy at Tejgaon College, and she currently teaches at Darul Ihsan University. It is

Coming back to her paintings, since art is only a leisure activity for Nasreen, one could see that she lacks a professional painter's acumen. Nevertheless, some of her works, including "Hemonto", "Motherhood 2-3", "Composition 1" and "Forceful" communicate a lucid sense of calm and tranquility. For example, "Motherhood 2-3" are acrylic and oil on canvas and these paintings are acutely emotional and are capable to impart sense of tenderness to the viewers.

In many of her abstract paintings she had shunned the use of lines. The subject of many of her works, including the abstract paintings is female figures and femininity. Liberated (acrylic), Scattering (oil) and Boundary (mixed medium) have feminist agendas. Although it may seem a little outdated, a recurring object in her works is flowers in vases in warm, glowing colour and sometimes in


On the whole, her work gives an insight into her affectionate mind. As for the school, one can't help feeling that it needs assistance.

The photos of the Bijoyer Sand Sculpture Festival 2010 are being exhibited at the Zainul Art Gallery, Faculty of Fine Arts (FFA), University of Dhaka. Organised by Green World, the three-day exhibition was inaugurated on July 13. The photos on display are images of the sculpture festival at Cox's Bazar which featured sand sculptures of the heroes of the Liberation War.

Sand sculptures are fascinating but short-lived artworks usually crafted on beaches. The sculpture festival was a joint initiative of Green World Communication Limited, Department of Sculpture, FFA, DU and Bangladesh Parjatan Corporation. Eminent sculptor Professor Hamiduzzaman Khan headed the young students' team along with three of his colleagues: Associate Professor Enamul Huq Enam, Md. A A M Kaoser Hassan Togo and Md. Atiqul Islam. The festival was the first of its kind in the country in terms of scale.
