# Nepal first to use Ctg port

Takes its goods from Morocco thru' Chapainawabganj

In a major step towards regional connectivity, Bangladesh allowed transit of goods to Nepal from yesterday.

Two Indian wagon trains left the Rohanpur Railway Station here for Nepal with 2,389 metric tonnes of diammonium phosphate (DAP) imported from Morocco by Agriculture Import Corporation Limited of Nepal, said officials.

The trains will enter Raxul-Birganj of Nepal via Singabad in Maldia district of India.

This is for the first time Bangladesh allowed Nepal to use the Chittagong port, river route and railway facility in line with a decision taken by Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and her Indian counterpart Manmohan Singh last year, they added.

According to the Joint Communiqué issued during Hasina's visit to India in January last year, Bangladesh agreed to give Nepal and Bhutan access to Chittagong and Mongla ports.

The two leaders also agreed to establish a broad gauge railway link between Rohanpur and Singabad for transit

## 30 lakh cases stay piled up

Law minister calls for people-friendly judicial process

The courts of Bangladesh have a backlog of around 30 lakh cases, causing a lot of sufferings to litigants, Law Minister Shafique Ahmed said yesterday.

Corruption by supporting staffs and officials of courts damages people's trust in the judiciary, and victimises litigants, he said.

Shafique made the remarks while inaugurating a training on alternative dispute resolution (ADR) at the Judicial Administration Training Institute (JATI) in the capital.

JATI and South Asian Institute of Advanced Legal and Human Rights Studies jointly organised the training in which 25 judges and 17 lawyers are participating.

Student dies as brick falls from highrise

A student was killed yesterday as a brick fell on his head from an under-construction multi-storey building on Panthapath in the capital.

Habibur Rahman Munna, 18, an HSC examinee of Tejgaon College, died on the spot at around 12:30pm as the brick fell on his head from the 10th floor of under-construction 15-storey Sagupta De Khan, a construction site of Sagupta Group.

He was returning home on foot after attending his ailing mother admitted to a hospital on Panthapath. Son of businessman Abu Kalam of East Tejribazar, Munna fell victim to the neglect of the construction
