Two siblings drown

Two siblings drowned in a ditch at Nagpara Sadari village under Bhanga upazila yesterday. Nazmul Munshi, 6, and Kamrul Munshi, 4, sons of Layek Munshi of the village were playing by a roadside ditch while their mother was separating jute from stalks at around 10:30 in the morning. When Nazmul fell in the ditch, Kamrul tried to save Nazmul and both drowned as they did not know how to swim. They were brought to Bhanga health complex where attending doctors declared them dead.

Boy murdered

Police recovered the body of an 11-year-old boy from a bamboo cluster at village Chalk Bhagabanpur in Sadullapur upazila yesterday morning. Police said Shahabul Islam Mollah, son of Chaku Mollah and a class five student went 'missing' after returning from school on Wednesday afternoon. Family members could not trace him despite frantic search. Later his body was recovered from a bamboo cluster. Chaku Mollah filed a case with Sadullapur police station.

Man to die for murder

UNB, Narayanganj

A court here on Wednesday convicted a man and sentenced him to death in a murder case. The convict was identified as Muslim, 50, son of Hasan Ali in Porshi area of Rugganj police station. According to the prosecution, Muslim hacked Kafiluddin with a sharp weapon leaving him critically wounded over land dispute in front of his house at Yusufganj under the police station on July 5 in 2000. Kafiluddin was admitted to a local hospital where he succumbed to his injuries later. Victim's son Helal Uddin filed a case with the police in this connection.

50 kg piranha fish seized

A mobile court yesterday seized 50 kilograms of banned piranha fish in Barduaree Haat area in Sherpur upazila yesterday. Abdur Rauf, senior fisheries officer of the upazila, said acting on secret information, the court conducted a drive in the area and seized 27 piranha fish each weighing about 1.5 kg, worth Tk 4,500 when the unscrupulous fish traders were selling the catch openly. However, the illegal fish traders managed to escape, he added.

CALLING KADER SIDDIQUI A RAZAKAR

Tangail KSJL sues 57 AL men

Tangail district unit of Krishak Sramik Janata League (KSJL) yesterday sued 57 Awami League men of Kalihati upazila for their alleged remarks against KSJL chief Abdul Kader Siddiqui Bir Uttam, branding him as a razakar.

Moloy Kumar Saha, KSJL district unit office secretary, filed the case against seven identified and 50 unidentified AL men with Senior Judicial Magistrate's Court, Tangail.

The identified accused are Kalihati Upazila Parishad Vice-Chairman and local AL leader Anwar Hossain Molla, upazila AL

President Mozaharul Islam Thandu, Durgapur Union Parishad (UP) Chairman and union AL leader Siraj Miah, former chairman of Salla UP Abdul Malek, and AL activists Abdul Majid Tota, Joynal Abedin and Rafiqul Islam.

After hearing, Judge Jannatul Ferdous Ibne Haque ordered the officer-in-charge (OC) of Kalihati Police Station to accept the case as an FIR, court sources said. A total of 11 people have been made witnesses in the case, sources added.

According to the case statement, Kalihati upazila unit of KSJL organised a meeting on the premises of Poshna Primary School at

Palima in Kalihati upazila on July 9, but could not hold the meeting due to restrictions imposed by the local administration.

When the KSJL men were leaving the meeting venue, the accused with lethal weapons swooped on them and also intercepted the motorcade of Kader Siddiqui at Palima bus stand near the meeting venue, the complainant said.

The AL men chanted objectionable slogans like "Kader Siddiqui Razakar, Ei Muhurtey Bangla Chhar," the stated in the statement, adding that they (AL men) also opened fire when the KSJL workers came forward to resist them.

JULY 6 ATTACK ON KHULNA LAWYERS

Case against 9 policemen

Nine policemen were sued yesterday on charge of attacking and severely injuring eleven lawyers 'without any provocation' on July 6 in front of Khulna District Bar Association.

Advocate Sheikh Rafiquzzaman, one of the eleven victims, filed the petition case with the court of senior metropolitan magistrate Swapan Kumar Sarker.

Twenty-two lawyers including president of Khulna District Bar Association advocate Masud Hossain Rony have been named as prosecution witnesses.

The court yesterday ordered the prosecution witnesses to appear on September 7 for their depo-

sition. The nine accused are Assistant Police Commissioner (Kotwali Zone) Md Alimuzzaman, OC of Khulna Sadar police station SM Kamruzzaman, Inspector (Forces) Md Shajahan, Sub-Inspector Pushpen Deb Nath, constables Tarek, Mukti Biswas, Najibul Islam, Kamrul Islam and Joynal.

The complainant stated in his petition that the accused attacked a procession brought out by lawyers on last July 6 in support of 4-party alliance called hartal for retaining the caretaker government system.

Eleven lawyers were severely injured as police charged baton without any provocation.

The injured lawyers are Abul Hossain Howlader,

Khan Liakat Ali, Golam Mowla, Anurag Banerjee, Nurul Hasan Ruba, Abdull Hossain Bacchu, Mohsin Jamaddar, Anisur Rahman Khan, Lashkar Shah Alam, Hafizur Rahman and SR Faruque.

The excesses done by the accused in dealing with a peaceful procession have disgraced us socially as we were abused in filthy language and baton charged without provocation.

We have been compelled to take shelter of the court to seek justice as number two accused OC SM Kamruzzaman of Khulna Sadar police station refused to receive our FIR on July 8, goes the complaint.

Contacted, number one accused AC Alimuzzaman denied allegation of any excess done while dealing with pro-hartal lawyers.

Sedition cases against 63 BGB men dropped

Sedition cases against 63 jawans of BGB (Border Guard Bangladesh) Satkhira and Shyamnagar battalions have been withdrawn as per decision of the home ministry.

Of the jawans, 27 are from BGB 41 Battalion at Satkhira Sadar while 36 from BGB 7 Battalion at Nildumur in Shyamnagar upazila.

Judge Sharif Uddin Azad of Additional District and Sessions Judge's Court relieved the jawans of

sedition charges following an appeal made by Public Prosecutor (PP) advocate Mustafa Lutfulah, court sources said.

Following mutiny at the two battalions on February 26 in 2009, sedition cases were filed against the jawans on May 13 the same year.

The then officer-in-charge (OC) of Satkhira Sadar Police Station Kamruzzaman filed the sedition cases against 27 jawans of 41 Battalion with the Chief Judicial Magistrate's Court while the then

officer-in-charge (OC) of Shyamnagar Police Station Matiar Rahman filed the cases against 36 jawans of 7 Battalion with the same court on the same day.

Immediately after filing of the sedition cases, the accused were arrested and produced in the Chief Judicial Magistrate's Court that sent them to jail hayat.

The complainants in the case statements said the jawans revolted against their officers at their respective battalions on February 26 in

2009, expressing solidarity with the mutineers of the BGB headquarters at Pilkhnana in the capital.

They looted firearms and ammunition from armouries, fired blank shots and took control of the battalions.

BGB special court sentenced 90 jawans of 41 Battalion and 56 jawans of 7 Battalion to different jail terms on March 2 and April 19 this year for their involvement in mutiny at their respective battalion on February 26 in 2009.

4 commit 'suicide' in Satkhira

Two housewives, an old man and an adolescent girl allegedly committed suicide in the district in the last 4-5 days.

The victims were identified as Bhujan Mondal, 57 of village Dakkhin Atulia in Shyamnagar upazila, Halima Khatun, 40 wife of Abdul Momin Mithu of village Nathpur in Kalaroa upazila, Rupa Khatun, 13 daughter of Abdul Mazed of village Kashempur in Sadar upazila and Dolly Akhtar, 26 wife of Md Masud Hossain alias Khokon of Puraton

Satkhira in the town.

Quoting local people police said, Bhujan Mondal committed suicide by hanging from a branch of a tree near his house at village Dakkhin Atulia at about 7-30 am on July 19.

As his son Debashish Mondal married Kalpona Rani Mondal of the same village ignoring his wish, he committed suicide, police said.

Halima Khatun committed suicide by hanging herself from the ceiling of her house at village Nathpur at about 8-30 pm on July 18.

Following a family feud, Rupa Khatun, a class seven student of Rasulpur High School in the town committed suicide in the same way at her house at about 9-30 pm on July 18.

Police said, Dolly Akhtar married Masud Hossain two years ago following an affair over cell phone.

When Dolly came to know that she is the second wife of Masud, she protested it. She used to raise the question why Masud married her and spoiled her life.

Over the issue, Masud began to torture her mercilessly. Failing to bear it anymore, Dolly took poison at about 7-30 am on July 17.
