Bangladesh and India will jointly inaugurate their first ever Border Haat today along the borders of Kurigram district in Bangladesh and West Garo Hill district in the Indian state of Meghalaya.

Bangladesh Commerce Minister Muhammad Faruk Khan and his Indian counterpart Anand Sharma will formally open the market, reports our New Delhi correspondent.

The haat has been set up on four bighas of no-man's land along the border at Rajibpur upazila in Kurigram.



UP results boost BNP confidence

Party favourites won chairmanship in nearly half of the unions in recent polls

The BNP high command considers the success at recent union parishad polls a big comeback for the party in grassroots politics as its favourites won chairmanship of about half of the unions across the country.

Struggling for about the two and a half years since the last parliamentary elections debacle, the main opposition appears upbeat after upsetting its archrival Awami League in the local government polls as well as municipality elections in January.


BNP is now looking to enhance organisational strength and resolve internal feud to intensify the anti-government movement, party policymakers say.
