Rokeya Sarani road barricaded after car hits schoolgirl

Locals and guardians of students of a school at West Shewrapara in the city's Mirpur yesterday put barricades on Begum Rokeya Sarani road for nearly three hours after a road accident in the morning left a schoolgirl injured.

The injured Fatema Akhter Chayan, 9, a student of class three of Monipur High School and College, was hit by a Mirpur-bound private car while she was crossing the road in a hurry around 7:15am. Her mother was at that time paying the rickshaw fare, said witnesses.

The locals rushed her to the adjacent Shewrapara Exim Bank Hospital and was later shifted to Orthopaedic Hospital. She was released after receiving first aid. Locals stopped and kept

the car there till police came and took it to Mirpur Police Station, said Officer-in-Charge (OC) Kazi Wazed Ali.

When news of the accident spread, the locals and the guardians barricaded the road, halting traffic movement and stranding hundreds of vehicles on both sides of the road, the OC added.

They demanded construction of a foot overbridge and a speed breaker on the spot on an emergency basis as around 6,400 school students and their guardians cross the road regularly. Traffic movement

resumed around 10:00am when the protesters were informed that the girl was out of danger and a speed breaker would be constructed within 72 hours, said the school's Principal Md Forhad Hossain.

Humayun Kabir Tipu, one of the guardians, said the guardians gave a written application to the local MP for construction of a foot over-bridge and a speed breaker there when the school opened in January.

Dhaka City Corporation began constructing speed breakers on both sides of the road in the afternoon.

Journalist Shahriar Kabir and historian Prof Muntasir Mamun at a discussion here yesterday said Bangladesh-India relations are based on the same philosophies of secularism, socialism and democracy and must get friendlier for economic and commercial gains.

Maintaining rivalry would incur more losses to Bangladesh than to India, they said.

The discussion styled "Bangladesh-India relations: From Bangabandhu to Sheikh Hasina" was organised by the district and city units of Ekatturer Ghatak Dalal Nirmul Committee at a city community centre. Language movement veteran Abul Hossain was in the chair.

Bangladesh suffered trade deficits following increase in illegal businesses when anti-liberation and fundamentalist forces came to power in Bangladesh and Congress Party was not in power in India, they said.

He said Bangladeshi television channels are not being broadcast in India as the owners are not getting adequate number of advertisements to cover their broadcasting expenses aboard.
