Retired police held on charge of cheating

Detective Branch (DB) of police arrested a retired police constable from the city's Banashree area on charge of taking money from several job seekers in the name of providing jobs at Border Guard Bangladesh and Bangladesh Army on Tuesday.

Police seized several fake appointment letters of BGB and army, fake seals, answer sheets, application and medical forms of army recruitment from the possession of detained Tariqul Islam, 45, son of late Mokam Mollah, of South Banashree of Khilgaon Police Station.

DB Senior Assistant Commissioner Abdul Ahad said they arrested Tariq following a case filed by one of the cheated job seekers, Shamim Ahmed, with Khilgaon Police Station on Tuesday.

13 killed in road crashes

Thirteen people were killed and 27 others injured in road accidents in the city and in Munshiganj, Natore, Satkhira, and people were killed and five others Dinajpur yesterday.

Our staff correspondent reports: A buspickup collision on Dhaka-Demra highway in Konapara left a minor boy and the pickup driver dead yesterday.

They are Rakibul Islam, 6, son of Rafiqul Islam of the city's Golapbagh in Jatrabari, and the driver, Abdul Khalek, 45.

Rakibul, who was aboard the pickup with his parents, was declared dead in Dhaka Medical College Hospital. The injured parents took primary treatment in the hospital.

Our Munshiganj correspondent reports: Five passengers and the driver of a CNG-run auto-rickshaw died as a truck crashed into the vehicle on Dhaka-Mawa highway in Sirajdikhan upazila yesterday.

The deceased are Ahladi Begum, 40, Meem, 20, Renu Begum, 55, Mainul, a sixmonth-old baby, and the auto-rickshaw driver Shahabuddin, 35. The other victim remained unidentified.

The bus also injured 20 people as it ploughed through pedestrians while fleeing the scene. Our Natore correspondent says: Four

wounded as a truck rammed a mini-truck at Khejurtola in Singra upazila yesterday. Roisuddin, 60, and Sakil Hossain, 45,

passengers of the mini-truck, died on the spot while Golam Hossain, 6, and its driver Uzzal died in Natore sadar hospital.

The injured were taken to different local hospitals and the sadar hospital.

Our Satkhira correspondent adds: An unidentified woman aged about 70 died on the spot after being knocked down by a truck on Satkhira-Kaliganj road in Alipur village of the sadar upazila yesterday.

Our Dinajpur correspondent says: A youth yesterday succumbed to his injuries inflicted as a truck hit his motorcycle from behind near Kasinathpur village under the sadar upazila Tuesday night.

The victim is Razu Mia, 20, son of Khademul Islam of Sheikhpura village under the upazila. Razu died in Dinajpur Medical College Hospital.

90 IAB men get bail

Two seperate division benches of High Court (HC) yesterday granted a onemonth anticipatory bail to 90 activists of Islami Andolan Bangladesh (IAB), accused in eight seperate criminal cases.

Some local individuals of Sonargaon, Siddhirganj and Fatullah of Narayanganj filed the cases with the respective police stations of the areas on July 12 and 20. The charges were for vandalising vehicles and blocking roads during a countrywide hartal enforced by IAB on July 10.

The accused including Atiqur Rahman, ameer of its Narayanganj unit, appeared before the HC benches for bail, Barrister Fakhrul Islam, one of their lawyers, told The Daily Star.

Five members of banned Islamist outfit Hizb ut-Tahrir

Rab arrested adviser of the organisation Mahmudul Bari, 41, from Shahjalal International Airport around 1:00am yesterday when he was trying to leave for Malaysia, he said. Bari was also the managing director of developer company, Silver Sand Reality.
