Govt hits back at critics

Toll climbs to 13; 4 more detained from UP, Kashmir

India's under-fire home minister hit back yesterday at heavy criticism of the government's counter-terrorism policies after a string of attacks against high-profile targets.

"I do not think anyone can accuse this government of not doing enough," P Chidambaram told reporters two days after a bomb ripped through a crowd outside New Delhi's High Court, killing 13 people.

The government -- and Chidambaram in particular -- has borne the brunt of public anger over India's apparent inability to prevent bombings in its cities, despite an overhaul of domestic security following the 2008 Mumbai attacks.

A day after the Delhi court blast, the front page of one national newspaper carried a large photo of the home minister under the one-word headline: "Clueless".

Chidambaram argued that India's sheer size, coupled with decades of "accumulated neglect" of internal security, meant that building sufficient counter-terror capacity would inevitably take time.

Experts say Indian security agencies, and in particular the police, suffer from underfunding, a lack of training and poor intelligence gathering.

Briefing reporters on the investigation into Wednesday's attack, Chidambaram said that police in Indian Kashmir had detained a man suspected of sending an email claiming responsibility for the court bombing.

The death toll from Wednesday's bomb blast at New Delhi's High Court has risen to 13 after a man died of his injuries in hospital and police detained 7 more in connection with the attack, police said yesterday.

Four more people are reportedly in a critical condition. Police in Indian Kashmir said yesterday they had

detained five people as they investigate an email claiming responsibility for the blast.

Two people were detained in Uttar Pradesh yesterday.

'One person was detained in Varanasi and another in Bela village on the outskirts of Balrampur district, essentially on account of their resemblance with the sketch of suspects released by Delhi Police,' said a top police officer.

Federal investigators have yet to confirm whether the email was indeed from HuJI. Another claim of responsibility, apparently from a home-grown militant outfit called Indian Mujahideen, was sent to media on Thursday.

The United States describes HuJI as a terrorist group with links to al-Qaeda, and it has been accused of carrying out attacks in India, Pakistan and Bangladesh.

Obama unveils \$447b jobs plan


US President Barack Obama Thursday unveiled a \$447 billion jobs plan which he said would "jolt" the stalled economy at an "urgent" time for a nation facing a deep economic and political crisis.

"I am sending this Congress a plan that you should pass right away. It's called the American Jobs Act," Obama told lawmakers, as senior officials said the plan, a mix of tax cuts and spending, would total \$447 billion.

Obama delivered the plan in a rare joint session of Congress, seeking to repair public trust in his economic management, to slice into 9.1 percent unemployment and to revive his own political fortunes.

Obama challenged Republicans to halt a "political circus" and immediately pass a bigger than expected \$447 billion jobs plan he said would jolt the "stalled" economy.

"The people of this country work



meet ours," Obama said.

"The question is whether, in the face of an ongoing national crisis, we can stop the political circus and actually do something to help the economy."

Obama said the initiative, called the American Jobs Act, would put people back to work and more money in the pockets of those who are work-

"It will create more jobs for construction workers, more jobs for teachers, more jobs for veterans, and more jobs for the long-term unemployed,' he said.

The centrepiece of the plan is a deeper than expected \$240 billion payroll tax cut for employers and employees meant to keep money in the pockets of those most in need, and most likely to spend extra cash to spur demand.

Hopes for renewed economic demand also got a boost on Thursday when Federal Reserve Chairman Ben Bernanke said the central bank was ready to employ various tools to provide an additional monetary stimulus.

But prospects for Obama's plan are uncertain, given blanket Republican opposition to new spending not balanced by steep budget cuts and a deeply polarized political climate already agitated by the coming election.

The plan will be paid for in future years, through deficit reductions, a factor that could spark opposition from some Republicans who may demand cuts in government programs to balance the new spending.

KEY POINTS OF OBAMA'S JOBS PLAN

Employer payroll tax holidays: Cuts in half businesses owners' share of payroll taxes, giving them more incentive to hire. No payroll taxes for new

workers. Cost: \$65 billion. Employee payroll tax breaks: A cut in social security and other deductions from workers' paychecks, giving households more money to spend. Cost: \$175 billion.

Investment incentives: Businesses will be allowed to deduct 100 percent of their investments in new plants and equipment in one year. Cost: \$5 billion.

Hiring soldiers and others: Businesses will get tax credits for hiring unemployed military veterans and the long-term unemployed. Cost: at least \$8 billion.

Protecting public sector jobs: Cash-pinched local authorities will get \$35 billion to rehire or avoid laying off teachers, police and firefighters.

Infrastructure investment: -A \$50 billion effort to modernise transport infrastructure,

-A \$10 billion for new public-private National Infrastructure Bank to fund long-term projects.

- Another \$30 billion is for improving schools - A \$15 billion for rehabilitating vacant homes and busi-

Unemployment benefits: Extending dole payments for millions of jobless, while allowing them to take parttime jobs and go through retraining programs. Cost: \$49b. - A path ways back to work fund. Cost: \$5b.

"On August 21, the Cabinet Purchase Committee considered another 19 projects worth \$122 million, approving all but two despite allegations of serious irregularities involving all the projects," it said. The committee on July 17, 2006 had rejected the home ministry's proposal for giving the contract to German bidder Giesecke and Devrient Gmbd.

The committee was especially critical of the identity card component, which it said had not been authorised by the Prime Minister's Office.

The purchase committee also criticised the home ministry for failing to prepare the legal and institutional framework for a national identity card programme, for not using international experts to evaluate the tender submissions, and for entrusting such a large undertaking to a single contractor.

It sent back the project to the home ministry with instructions to re-tender a revised project for the machine readable passports and visa only. In early August that year, the ministry reportedly instructed officials to prepare a new ten-

The project was revived on instructions from the PMO, according to reports. On August 15, the then state minister for home affairs Lutfozzaman Babar confirmed in an interview with The Daily Star that the Cabinet Division had instructed him to resubmit the project to the purchase committee.

The dispatch said the project was not considered at the committee meeting on August 21, but was expected to be considered at its next meeting.

Other questionable procurements that were under consideration or approved included telecom, sanitation and transportation infrastructure projects, a dozen land deals, retroactive payments for unsolicited maintenance services at government power plants, and several power sector proposals, the cable said.

"These join recent allegations of government support for syndicates involved in price manipulation of basic commodities, including rice and sugar, anecdotal reports of an increase in the value of bribes paid to police, magistrates and other government officials throughout the bureaucracy, and a breaking scandal involving false beneficial owner stock accounts opened to evade rules governing subscriptions to initial public offerings."

Butenis wrote it was widely believed that the prime minister's two sons, as well as relatives of other senior ministers, were directly involved in promoting such questionable deals in exchange for significant "commissions".

In at least two tenders for police radio equipment, an apparent victory by US bidder Motorola was overturned following a direct intervention from Tarique Rahman to Babar on behalf of Tarique's brother Arafat Rahman Koko, who was working on behalf of Singapore Technologies, according to the cable. Singapore Technologies

would also have a significant role in the project on machine readable passports and national identity cards, according to embassy sources, the dispatch said.

"The present level of grand corruption was unprecedented and significantly greater than corruption at the end of the previous Awami League government," Iftekhar Zaman, executive director of Transparency International Bangladesh (TIB), told an US embassy officer on August 23, 2006.

Butenis cited that BNP cancelled many contracts issued in the waning days of the previous government -officially because of corruption concerns though often for political reasons.

"If elected, Awami League will probably take similar action against late-term BNP deals, both to demonstrate its own anticorruption credentials and to create fresh opportunities to garner "commissions" from re-tendered contracts," the cable read.

"For this reason, the BNP's inability to close lastminute deals in the power and energy sectors may be the one silver-lining in the otherwise dark cloud of corruption hanging over the BNP's final months in office."

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Veteran rights activist jailed in China

Chinese veteran rights activist and doctor Wang Lihong was sentenced yesterday to nine months in jail for "creating a disturbance", as part of what campaigners say is a broad crackdown on dissent.

The 55-year-old, a veteran of China's 1989 prodemocracy movement in Tiananmen Square, plans to appeal the sentence in the next 10 days, her lawyer Han Yicun told AFP.

Wang was arrested in April, after online calls for Arab-style protests spooked authorities, prompting a widespread clampdown on dissent.
