## Ex-school committee chief locks school for failing to get re-elected

Students and teachers of Krishnapur High School in Sadullapur upazila could not enter the school on Thursday, the opening day after Ramadan and Eid holidays, as former president of the managing committee closed the main entrance.

Failing to get elected president of the school managing committee in the recently held election, Sayed Ahmed Sarker and his men blocked the main gate of the school with bamboo fence and locked all classrooms and common room.

Shafier Rahman, headmaster of the school, informed the upazila nirbahi officer (UNO) of the matter and sought his intervention in this regard.

Though the UNO assured the headmaster of taking urgent steps to resolve the issue, the school remained closed as of yesterday.

Contacted, Sayed Ahmed said he demanded dissolution of the newly elected managing committee, alleging that the election was not fair. He also demanded reelection to the committee. Claiming himself as

donor of the school, the former president of the

managing committee also urged the authorities concerned to change the name of the school.

Sayed Ahmed said he will not remove the bamboo fence from the main gate and unlock the classrooms until the present committee is dissolved.

Headmaster Shafier Rahman alleged that Sayed Ahmed had started his anti-school activities after his debacle in the election. He and his men gave threat to the newly elected members and asked them not to come to the school, the headmaster said.

Education of the students is being hampered due to the 'evil acts' of the former president and his men, said Amjad Hossain, the newly elected president of school managing committee.

The train started journey on November 12, 2010 and went off the track for 50 days after its inception on the plea of locomotive and manpower shortage, according to railway sources.

To ease rail communication in northern districts of Rangpur Division, the train used to shuttle between Bonarpara in Gaibandha and Dinajpur via Kawnia. It left Bonarapara station at 6:30 am and returned from Dinajpur at 2:50 pm every-

> Normal rail communication restored yesterday after about three hours when the railway divisional manger at Lalmonirhat assured the agitating people of resuming the two trains with immediate



### 2 housewives killed allegedly for dowry

Two housewives were tortured to death allegedly by dowry in Joypurhat and Thakurgaon districts on Friday and Tuesday.

A housewife was beaten to death allegedly by her husband for dowry in Akkelpur upazila of Joypurhat on Friday evening, reports our correspondent in Dinajpur.

The victim was identified as Tanzila Begum, 25, wife of Khorshed Alam of village Dewra-Khoslapara in the upazila.

Akkelpur police quoting villagers said Khorshed Alam used to torture Tanzila physically and mentally for dowry since they got married a few years ago. On Thursday, the couple

locked in an altercation over the issue. Khorshed again picked up a quarrel on Friday as his wife remained indifferent over the dowry. This agitated Korshed. He

started beating Tanzila and at one stage kicked on her abdomen. Tanzila fainted on the

spot. Her husband then fled the scene pouring poison in her mouth to prove that she tried to commit suicide. After half an hour, neigh-

bours rescued her and took her to Akkelpur upazila health complex where doctors declared her death. In Thakurgaon, a house-

wife was murdered allegedly by husband and inlaws at Mohammadpur village in Sadar upazila on Tuesday afternoon, reports our correspondent.

A murder case was filed on Wednesday evening against the victim's husband and four others after some injury marks were found on the victim's body during autopsy.

Victim Nur Banu, 26, was

Police and victim's famhusbands and in-laws for ily members said Nur Banu, daughter of Sirajul Islam of Perbuki village in Sadar upazila was married to Ainat Ali, 28, son of Azmat Ali of Mohammadpur village of the same upazila two years ago.

Ainat Ali and his family members used to torture Nur Banu after her marriage to realise more dowry.

On Tuesday afternoon, when Nur Banu died of torture, her husband and other members of the family poured poison in her mouth and told villagers that she had committed suicide. They later brought her to Thakurgaon Sadar hospital where the doctors declared her dead.

Mystery shrouded death of a female college student at Purbapara of Banogram in Santhia upazila.

Neighbours said she died after taking excessive sedative following a discord with her fiancée. But family sources claimed she committed suicide after her mother scolded her over a family matter.

Neighbours alleged police handed over the body to her family without postmortem.
