Abducted schoolgirl rescued

A schoolgirl was rescued from Natore municipality area early yesterday after 10 days of abduction. Police said, Masum Ali *alias* Mahamudul Hassan along with his men abducted the 14-year-old daughter of Abdur Rahman of village Ahmadpur. The girl was a student of class seven at a local high school in Sujanagar upazila under Pabna district. She was abducted on September 1 while returning home from school, police said. Following a secret information, Sujanagar police led by sub inspector Md Zulfikar Ali raided a house at Alaipur village in Natore municipality area early yesterday. They rescued the girl and caught Mahamudul Hassan red-handed from the spot.

Acid attack on woman

A housewife was severely injured in acid attack at village Baliadah in Tala upazila Friday night. Victim Saleha Begum, 50, is wife of late Arshad Ali. Quoting local people police said, criminals threw acid on Saleha at about 11:30 pm when she was sleeping on the veranda. She sustained severe burn injuries on hands, legs, head, face and chest. Hearing her screams, other members of the house came to the spot and took her to Tala upazila health complex in critical condition. She was later shifted to Dhaka for better treatment with the help of Acid Survivors Foundation the next day.

One jailed for stalking

A mobile court yesterday sentenced a man for stalking a schoolgirl. The convict was identified as Mamunur Rashid, 37, son of Rafiqur Rahman of Vatapara village in Sorisabari upazila of Tangail district and an official of youth directorate in Kaliganj upazila. Sub-Inspector (SI) of Lalmonirhat Sadar PS said, local people caught Mamun in front Lalmonirhat Government Girls High School when he was stalking a class nine girl at around 4:30 pm on Saturday. Locals handed him over to police and police produced him before the mobile court.

Forest Department officials, acting on secret information, raided the market and arrested poachers Mosharrar Khalifa, 65, and Firoz Sawdagar, 45, of Nalbunia village under the upazila. Four sharp weapons were also recovered from their possession.

11 Satkhira shops looted

Robbers looted 11 shops at Shakhra Bazar in Sadar upazila on Saturday night. The gang decamped with the booties including cash, silver ornament, mobile sets and other valuables worth Tk 5 lakh from the shops. Quoting local people police said, robbers numbering 10 to 15, armed with deadly weapons, raided the bazar and entered first the shop owned by Lovelu by breaking open its door. Later they looted shops owned by Abul Kashem, Emdadul Haque, Golam Mostafa, a Jewellery shop owned by Anup Kumar and six other shops till 1:00 am.

Trader beaten to death

A fish trader was beaten to death at Ghoradia tempo stand in the district town Friday. The deceased was identified as Dulal Miah, 25, son of Arun Ali of village Hatubhanga in Raypur upazila. Local people said Dulal locked in an altercation with an auto-rickshaw driver as the man damaged his fish baskets when he went to a shop keeping the baskets by the roadside. At one stage, local criminal Babu Miah along with his gang taking side of the driver attacked and beat Dulal mercilessly leaving him seriously injured. The victim was rushed to the Sadar Hospital where the attending doctor declared him dead.

35 hurt in Kurigram clash

At least 35 people were injured in a fierce clash between two rival groups over land dispute at Tekani Char village in Roumari upazila on Saturday. Police said there was a long-standing dispute between Jonab Ali of the village and Abdul Wahab of neighbouring Paler Char village over the ownership of the two-bigha of land. Locals said when the people of Wahab tried to plant saplings on the disputed land at noon, Jonab Ali and his men resisted them triggering a noisy argument. Later, both the groups equipped with lethal weapons, brickbats and sticks attacked each other leaving 35 people from both sides injured.

10 shops gutted in Barguna

A devastating fire gutted 10 shops at a market in Patharghata upazila headquarters early Saturday. Local people said the fire broke out at a shop at Padma Bazaar at about 3:00 am and soon engulfed the adjacent shops. The affected shop owners claimed that the extent of loss from the fire could go up to Tk 10 lakh.

Transport workers assault doc triggering strike

Counter-strike to free offenders

All medical stores, private clinics and the government hospital in Gaibandha town remained closed for six hours from 6:00am yesterday protesting assault on a child specialist by transport workers on Saturday.

On the other hand, transport workers went on an indefinite strike in the district the same day demanding release of three transport workers arrested immediately after the Saturday's incident. They, however, withdrew the strike following a meeting at the deputy commissioner's office in the afternoon.

The trouble began on Saturday afternoon when Monu Mia, a transport

worker, brought his ailing child to the private chamber of child specialist Dr Abdul Malek at Shoni Mandir Road in the town.

As Monu tried to enter the doctor's chamber, breaking serial, his (doctor's) attendant refused to let him go inside. Monu became furious and swooped on the attendant.

Hearing the news, a group of transport workers rushed to the spot, assaulted child specialist Dr Abdul Malek and ransacked his chamber.

Being informed, police went there and arrested three transport workers- Ansar Ali, Kiron and Mithu Mia-on the spot while the rest managed to flee.

Immediately after the incident, Bangladesh

Medical Association (BMA) Gaibandha unit protested assault on Dr Abdul Makek. At the call of BMA district unit, all medical stores, private clinics and the government hospital observed a half day strike in the town yesterday.

Following arrest of the three transport workers, District Motor-Truck Sramik union put up barricades on roads at different points and went on an indefinite strike in the district yesterday morning.

The deputy commissioner sat with the BMA and transport union leaders at his office yesterday afternoon to resolve the crisis. After a fruitful discussion, the transport union called off its strike.

AL LEADER MURDER IN KISHOREGANJ

Six including 3 siblings to die, 8 get life

Six people including three siblings were sentenced to death while eight to life term rigorous imprisonment (RI) in a sensational Awami League (AL) leader murder case of Sadar upazila.

Those sentenced to death are three brothers-- Md Kabir Rabbani Jewel, 36, Md Muazzem Hossain Rubel, 28, and Md Novel, 23, sons of late MA Karim of Austabarga village in Sadar upazila-- and Md Babul Mia, 42, Md Rahim Khan, 55, and Mamun Mia, 26, of the same village.

The life term RI convicts are former UP member Abdul Ahad Khan, 55, of Austabarga village, Babu Khan, 22, Md Angur Mia, 32, Awal Khan, 38, Akbar Hossain Renu, 50, Md Dulal Mia, 60, Sabuj Mia, 29, of

Sadullarchar village and Samsul Alam Sarker, 50, of Dowkia village in Sadar upazila. Of the convicts, three brothers--Jewel, Rubel and Novel-- are still at large while the others are in jail.

All the convicts were also fined Tk 50 thousand each, in default, to suffer one year more in jail.

According to the prosecution and Kishoreganj public prosecutor (PP) advocate Shah Azizul Huq, AL leader Shahidul Alam Khan alias Shahid, 48, information and research secretary of Kishoreganj Sadar upazila Awami League was attacked by a gang in broad daylight on April 7, 2006 near his house at Sadullarchar bazar.

Shahid was going to market from his house along with one Khokan Mia by a motorbike.

The gang hacked Shahid, son of late Sadar upazila

chairman Abdul Bari Khan, indiscriminately with a sharp weapon.

Later, locals rushed him to Kishoreganj Adhunik Sadar Hospital but he succumbed to his injuries on the way.

The following day, Farid Ahmed, brother of the deceased, filed a murder case with Kishoreganj Sadar police station.

Md Akteruzzaman, sub-inspector (SI) of Sadar PS and investigation officer of the case submitted chargesheet in the case on May 21 the same year.

Later, considering it as a sensational case, it was shifted to Dhaka Speedy Trial Tribunal on November 28, 2010.

Md Mutahar Hossain, judge of Dhaka Speedy Trial Tribunal-4 handed down the verdict yesterday in a crowded courtroom.

Students go on rampage as school under lock and key

Students of Chapporhati High School in Sunderganj upazila on Saturday staged a demonstration demanding reopening of the school.

The students came to the school on Thursday, the opening day after Ramadan and Eid holidays. But they had to go back as all classrooms were under lock and key.

Seeing a notice hung by the headmaster, suspending classes for an indefinite period on Saturday, the students of the school became agitated.

They entered the classrooms, breaking open the doors and damaged chairs and benches. Later, the students brought out a procession demanding reopening of the school.

Before Eid vacation, the managing committee of the school brought corruption charge against Headmaster Abdul Ahad Bakul and put him under suspension.

The committee asked the headmaster to hand over charges to assistant teacher Abdur Rashid, but he did not comply with the order. He said the committee's deci-

sion was unfair and his suspension was illegal.

The school managing committee could not resolve the issue as of yesterday as assistant teacher Abdur Rashid was not available in the area.


Khorshed Alam, chairman of Chapporhati Union Parishad, said he is trying to resolve the issue in consultation with the managing committee.

Contacted, Sunderganj Upazila Nirbahi Officer (UNO) Shamsul Azam said necessary steps are being taken to reopen the school as soon as possible.


