Touts cash in on ferry mess

STAR REPORT

Frequent suspension of ferry service on Paturia-Daulatdia and Mawa-Kawrakandi routes has been disrupting communication between Dhaka and 21 southwestern districts for the last few days and some unscrupulous people are taking full advantage of the situation.

Ferry service on both the routes was suspended for several hours yesterday since several ferries ran aground in the Padma.

The Paturia-Daulatdia service halted around midday yesterday after ferry Khan Jahan Ali got stuck in a char hidden beneath the surface of the water. It, however, got loose after 10 minutes of frantic manoeuvring of the vessel. Ferry Shah Ali also got stuck around 5:30pm halting the service until 7:30 in the evening, reports our Manikganj correspondent.

The disruption stranded almost 2,000 buses and trucks at the ferry terminals of Daulatdia and Paturia where some people were selling truckers ferry tickets for almost twice the fare and allowing them to cut the queue.

A number of officials and employees of Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Corporation, the police and scalpers were allegedly taking Tk 600-1,000 on top of the ferry tickets and allowing truckers to cut the queue.

52 drug companies in 'dreadful' state

Show-cause notice to be served on recommendations of JS committee

The Directorate of Drug Administration will serve show-cause notices on more than 52 drug companies since their condition is "dreadful" and medicines manufactured by them pose a "serious threat" to public health.

It took the decision yesterday following recommendations by the parliamentary standing committee on health and family welfare ministry.

The House body had formed a subcommittee consisting of experts and pharmacists from Dhaka, Jahangirnagar and Rajshahi universities to give a report on all drug manufacturing companies in the country. The death of over 26 children after taking Rid Pharma's toxic syrup in July and August 2009 prompted formation of it.

The sub-committee headed by ruling Awami League lawmaker Nazmul Hasan

submitted its voluminous report to the House watchdog last month.

The report said the condition and product quality of 52 drug manufacturing companies are "dreadful".

"We wonder how those companies had got licence and how their licences are still remaining valid," the committee said in its

These companies cannot be termed | be finalised," said Prime drug manufacturing ones since it is impossible for them to manufacture safe drugs, it said. "Their [52 companies] entire activities are nothing but fraud, and the medicines they manufacture pose a serious threat to public health."

Of the country's 151 drug companies, 22 are of very high standard, and they are capable of manufacturing world standard medicines, the report mentioned.

10 hospitals involved

Organ trader makes confession

Tareque Azam, the key suspect of a network of organ trade in the country, gave his confessional statement before a Joypurhat magistrate court yesterday.

In his confession, he named some hospitals, clinics and doctors involved in the illicit business, said F Karim, officer-in-charge of Kalai Police Station in Joypurhat.

Tareque, also known as Babul Chowdhury, named a private hospital in the capital that keeps a list of potential organ sellers and has links with hospitals across the world. He also named four people of Joypurhat and three

people of the city who act as middlemen, and 10 other hospitals of the capital involved with the network, Karim added.

The OC, however, would not disclose the names.

Tareque, who was arrested by detective police in the capital on Thursday, was produced before the Chief Judicial Magistrate Court of Jahangir Alam to give his confessional statement.
