

TRAGIC DEATH OF BOY

Two more arrested in Companyganj

Detective Branch (DB) of police on Sunday night arrested two more people in connection with the tragic death of hapless boy Shamsuddin Milon in Companyganj upazila on July 27.

Police allegedly let a mob beat the 17-year-old boy to death after he was held on suspicion of being a robber.

Billal Hossain, officer-in-charge (OC) of DB police said, acting on a tip-off, a DB team with the help of Companyganj police arrested Sajib and Babul Chowdhury from Teker Bazar area of Basurhat on Sunday night. They will be quizzed at the district head office of DB police, he said.

Both the arrestees were detected from a video footage captured by a mobile phone during the incident, added the OC.

Earlier, in separate drives police arrested Jafar Iqbal, Harunur Rashid, Shah Alam, Abdul Khaleq and Abul Khair from different villages under Charkakra union of the upazila.

On July 27, a police team led by sub-inspector Akramuddin Sheikh picked up Milon on his van suspecting him as a robber.

When the van reached Teker Bazar, curious locals asked police about his offence. Without giving a second thought, police told them that the boy committed robbery although there was no case filed against him with any police station.

Hearing this, the enraged locals all of a sudden pulled down the boy from van and beat him dead while police silently watched the senseless act.

On August 3, Milon's mother Kohinoor Begum filed a petition case with the Judicial Magistrate's Court alleging that villagers beat her innocent son to death in the presence of police suspecting him as a robber. The case was later sent to DB police.

Meanwhile, the businessmen of Tekerhat Bazar pulled their shutters down and barricaded Basurhat-Chaprashirhat road from 8:00am to 11:00am yesterday protesting the arrest of Sajib and Babul.

AUG 31 LOOTING OF SHOPS

Rangpur jewellers observe strike

Jewellers observed a half-day strike in Rangpur town yesterday demanding arrest of those who looted gold ornaments from two jewellery shops in the town on the night of August 31.

They kept the shutters of their shops down for eight hours from 6:00am and formed a human chain at Kachari Bazar at noon.

Other businessmen in town extended their support to the strike and joined the human chain programme that lasted for an hour.

Gold ornaments worth about Tk 40 lakh were looted from two jewellery shops--Uttara Jewellers and Bodhua Jewellers-- at Jahaj Company point in Rangpur town. Thieves broke open the shops on the night of August 31 and took away the gold ornaments.

The owners of the two shops lodged cases with Rangpur Kotwali Police Station on September 1. Police arrested two night guards of the area on September 2. But on one of the gang was arrested as of yesterday.

58 hurt, 25 houses vandalised during AL factional clashes

At least 58 people were injured and 25 houses vandalised during AL factional clashes in two upazilas of the district yesterday.

In Sreepur upazila, the supporters of Mahfuzur Rahman, organising secretary of AL Amalsar union unit, and Abu Osman, publicity secretary of the unit, clashed at Badanpur and Bilnathur villages under the union in the morning.

Locals said the clash ensued following an altercation between Ebadat Mian, a supporter of Mahfuz, and Abu Osman over demarcation of a land at Badanpur village at around 8:00am.

After half an hour, the supporters of Mahfuz and Osman equipped with lethal weapons attacked each other at Badanpur and adjacent Bilnathur village, leaving at least 28 people from both sides injured.

At least 25 houses at the two villages were ransacked and looted during the clash that lasted for two and a half hours.

Being informed, police rushed to the spot, dispersed the clashing groups and brought the situation under control. No case in connection with the incident was lodged with the police station concerned as of filing of this report at 5:30pm.

Police and locals said the clash was a sequel to a long standing feud between Mahfuz and Osman over establishing supremacy in the union.

Of the injured, 16 were admitted to Magura Sadar Hospital and Sreepur Upazila Health Complex while the rest given first aid.

Kazi Abdus Salek, officer-in-charge (OC) of Sreepur Police Station, said police have been deployed in the area to avert any further clash.

In Mohammadpur upazila, two rival

groups of AL ward committee under Nohata union clashed at Khalishakhali village at around 10:00am, leaving at least 30 people from both sides injured.

Police and locals said the rival groups-one led by Arifuzzaman and the other by Daud Biswas- clashed following an altercation over theft of jute from two jute godowns of AL supporters Khabiruddin and Humayan Mondal at Khalishakhali Bazar.

The clashing groups hurled brick chips and used sharp weapons and sticks during the clash that continued for an hour. Law enforcers from Mohammadpur Police Station went to the spot and brought the situation under control.

The injured people were admitted to Magura Sadar Hospital, Mohammadpur Upazila Health Complex and Narail Sadar Hospital. No one was arrested in connection with the clash as of 6:00pm yesterday.

PANCHAGARH TRIPLE MURDER

Court acquits all the accused for want of witnesses

A Panchagarh court acquitted all the accused in a sensational triple murder case on Sunday after 18 years of the gruesome incident.

Additional District and Sessions Judge Kazi AKM Joynal Abedin pronounced the verdict in a crowded courtroom in the afternoon. He acquitted the accused as the murder charge brought against them could not be proved for want of witnesses.

According to the prosecution, former chairman of Marea union parishad in Boda upazila Insan Ali, his brother-in-law Omar Ali and grandson Abdus Sattar were murdered on 30 May in 1993 at Nazirganj Sal tree orchard adjacent to Indian enclave Salbari. Chairman Insan Ali went there as the then tohoshildar (land office staff) of Marea union called him to visit the Sal orchard from where some trees were stolen.

All of a sudden, a group of people allegedly led by local Awami League leader and former Marea union parishad chairman Waliul Islam alias Montu Chairman attacked them and killed

Insan Ali on the spot. Two other persons--Sattar and Omar Ali--were brought to enclave area alive and then killed. After the killing, the accused buried the three bodies in a jute field.

After three days of killing, villagers who went to the enclave recovered the body. They also set fire to several houses there.

Insan Ali's son and former chairman of the same UP Abdur Razzak filed a case with Boda police station the next day accusing 30 people including Waliul Islam Montu and others.

Investigating the case, two charge sheets were submitted separately on different times. Officer in-charge of Boda police station Mominul Islam submitted the final report of the case on 26 January 2008.

Of the 30 accused, Azizul Haque, Abu Yusuf Zaman Mukul, Anwarul Islam and Brozen Roy died during the investigation.

Contacted, victim's son Abdur Razzak said, "We are frustrated for being deprived of justice."

We will take decision on our next course of action on getting the certified copy of the judgement, he added.

6 robbers arrested in Moulvibazar

Police in a drive arrested six alleged robbers when they were taking preparation to commit robbery in Sunchara Tea Garden area in Kamalganj upazila early yesterday.

The arrestees are: Makbul Hossain, 50, son of Imam Mia, Ibrahim Ali, 35, Selim Mia, 20, son of Makbul Mia, Abul Kalam, 26, son of Mamun Mia, Kamrul Islam, 18, and Babul Mia, 20 of Chitolia Kalisali

Acting on secret information, a team of Komolganj police conducted a drive in the area and held six members of a gang of 10/12 along with sharp weapon after a hot chase at about 1-45 am. However the rest gangsters managed to escape.

Police said the arrested gangsters were wanted in several cases including for murder, robbery and snatching.

ABDUCTION OF 9 FOR 'RANSOM'

Two more Jubo League men held

Police on Sunday night arrested two more Jubo League (JL) activists from different areas of the town on charge of kidnapping five people from Madrasa

Mor area in the town.

The arrestees were identified as Hasu Mia, 28, son of Alam Hossain of Kandivitua area in the town and Sajeeb Hossain, 30, son of Murad Ali of Alaipur area.

Earlier on Sunday afternoon, State Minister for Youth and Sports Ahad Ali Sarker rescued five people from a gang of kidnapers and helped police arrest Jubo League activist Rajib, 24, also son of Azibor Ali of Bolaripara of the town from the district Jubo League office near Hemangini Bridge in the town.

The rescued are Abdul Malek of Bagha upazila of Rajshahi and Abdur Rashid, Golam Mostafa and Abu Raihan Rentu of Lalpur upazila and Shahin of Boraigram upazila of Natore district.

Malek said they were abducted by nine men and taken to the Jubo League office around 2:00pm while they were returning home after attending a Natore court in connection with a case.

The men told Malek to withdraw the case he filed against Abdul Jalil and Abdul Karim of Lalpur upazila and demanded Tk 50,000 as ransom.

Ahad, also the acting general secretary of Natore unit Awami League, said he rushed to the Jubo League office with police on Sunday as soon as he heard of the kidnapping while returning from a meeting.

Officer in-charge Nazrul Islam of Sadar police station said, Rajib confessed to his involvement and said 8 to 9 people, namely Hasu, Sajeeb, Hira and Bappi, were with him.

Malek also lodged a case accusing nine people

with Natore police station on the same night.

Meanwhile, at a press conference at the district JL office yesterday noon, Shafiqul Islam Shimul, the secretary of Natore district unit JL claimed that no JL

man was involved in the abduction incident.

Shimul, also Natore Sadar upazila chairman also demanded immediate withdrawal of the case against the party activists.
