

One killed in gunfight

At least one was killed and five others injured in a 'gunfight' between a gang of illegal loggers and forest guards in Tulabagan on Cox's Bazar-Teknaf Road yesterday morning.

The deceased was identified as Kabir Hossain, 33, an alleged logger from Chowkidarpara of Ramu upazila of the district.

Bipul Krishna Das, divisional forest officer of Cox's Bazar (DFO) said the incident occurred when some forest guards spotted a gang of 100 illegal loggers felling

trees in the area. Following the guards protests, the loggers launched an attack on them which triggered the gunfight, said the DFO.

Kabir was caught in the line of fire and died on the spot while five others were hurt, including Nazrul Islam, a forest guard, he added.

Khushi Mohan Das, a local forester filed a case with Ramu Police Station accusing over 100 unidentified people including an injured logger Md Yousuf.

ACC starts action against 448 self-confessed corrupt people

The Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) has launched action against all the 448 people who were exempted by now defunct Truth and Accountability Commission (Tac) for confessing their involvement in corruption and surrendering the ill-gotten wealth.

In its routine monthly meeting with the media, ACC Director General (admin and establishment) Farrukh Ahmed briefed journalists on the decision at its headquarters yesterday.

About 270 of the total self-confessed corrupt were accused in corruption cases filed by the ACC at the time when they sought clemency from Tac, halting the proceedings of all the cases against
