HSC results under BOU published

Results of the first and second year examinations of the Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) Programme under Bangladesh Open University (BOU) were announced in the grading system yesterday.

A total of 1,01,434 students appeared in the examinations. Of them, 26,266 students became successful, says a BOU press release.

The pass percentage is 38.81. Of the successful candidates, only one secured A+, 175 got A, and 1,375 received A-. Besides, 4,821 were placed in B, 14,813 in C and 5,081 in D grade.

Of the successful students, 13,138 or 61.35 percent are male and 13,128 or 66.11 are female, the release said. Examinees have been advised to contact their respective HSC's Tutorial Centres to know the result on Sunday.

"We have to start talks immediately, not even waiting for two weeks...it is urgent because if the deal is not signed, it will create further misunderstanding," she said.

She was talking to The Daily Star after attending a certificate awarding ceremony at Nabab Nawab Ali Chowdhury Senate Bhaban of Dhaka University (DU).

The Teesta water-sharing treaty

was not signed during Indian Prime Minister Manmohan Singh's visit to Dhaka on September 6 as Paschimbanga (West Bengal) Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee disagreed at the last-minute.
