Santos starts drilling new wells for gas next week

Aiming to increase gas supply to industries in Chittagong, Australian gas and oil exploration company Santos will start searching for gas by drilling three new wells in Sangu gas field in the Bay of Bengal from next week. The plan was presented by Santos

Bangladesh President John Chambers at a programme it organised at a city hotel here on Wednesday.

The three wells, South Sangu, Sangu 11 and Sangu North East, situated in Block 16 in the Bay, would be drilled at a cost of US\$126 million, he said.

"We hope to be able to continue producing gas for a number of years to come if we are successful in this project and it will significantly help

Chittagong solve its energy crisis," he

The present gas field in Sangu, 45 kilometres from shore, provides 14.5 to 16 million cubic feet of gas per day to the national grid, said sources. John said they hope to start drilling

at South Sangu, around 5 kilometres away from the present gas field in Sangu, within next week after arrival of the drilling rig from Singapore. The rig, being towed from

Singapore, is about to enter Bangladesh waters and should arrive at the site on September 17 or the following day, he informed.

Presence of gas can be determined within one and a half months. Then it would take another one and a half years to set up a platform and the pipes to bring the gas ashore, he said.

There is already a platform at Sangu 11, situated 1.5 kilometres to the North of the Sangu platform, and drilling would be held between November this year and January 2012, said John. Depending on the success, gas can be supplied from here after February, he added.

Sangu North East is situated 4 kilometres away from the Sangu platform. But the drilling there would start after completion at the first two wells, he said.

Lawmaker Abul Kashem thanked Santos for undertaking such a project though it is a risky investment and hoped it would help solve the gas crisis in Chittagong. He ensured of all-out support to make the project a success.

Australian High Commissioner Justin Lee termed Santos as the largest

project would benefit both Santos and the Chittagong industries. Terming Bangladesh as the second

investor in Bangladesh and hoped the

largest trading partner of Australia in South Asia, Justin said, "Our two way trade with Bangladesh increased dramatically in recent years. The trade was only US \$ 300 million four years back while it was US\$715 million last year." Petrobangla Director (Finance)

Rafiqul Islam Khan congratulated Santos for taking such an initiative to explore the new areas to increase the production of gas from the offshore which will aid the country's economic development.

Petrobangla Director Mohammad Imaduddin and Santos Vice President ABA Siraj Uddowlah also spoke at the programme.

'Form caretaking council to hold fair elections'

Against the ongoing debate over scrapping the caretaker government system, a proposal for formation of a new body, comprised of people from all walks of life, to hold acceptable national elections was made yesterday. The body titled "Election Caretaking Council" (ECC) would

comprise of political parties, Election Commission (EC), civil society members, professionals and non-government organisations from national to union levels to make national polls neutral and acceptable. Bangladesh Manobadhikar Samonnoy Parishad (BMSP), a

human rights organisation, placed the proposal at a discussion it organised at Jatiya Press Club in the city yesterday. BMSP President AHM Noman read out the proposal. BMSP representatives said ECC would function for one year,

nine months before election day and three months after the poll, helping EC select primary candidacy, carry out publicity, conduct the election and announce results.

Speakers at the discussion said participation of people from other segments of society alongside political parties and EC is essential to make an election credible and acceptable to all. Speaking as the chief guest, National Human Rights

Commission Chairman Dr Mizanur Rahman termed ECC an attempt to involve people in the election process and said the new model will be able to supervise all segments of the election. "The caretaker government system was introduced to hold an acceptable election but after the 1/11, we saw the negative

side of a caretaker government, which caused panic among us," said Mizanur. He also stressed the need for an independent and powerful

EC to hold an acceptable election. Presiding over the discussion, former adviser to a caretaker

government ASM Shahjahan said involvement of political parties is important to make the new proposal a success. Taleya Rehman, co-chairperson of Election Working Group,

said the new proposal can be an ideal suggestion to involve civil society in the election process. Former BMSP president Binoy Krishna Mallik and former

secretary Hedayetul Islam Chowdhury also spoke at the programme.

'Term drivers service providers not killers'

Proposal to raise grant by at least 60 times

An inter-ministerial meeting at the home ministry yesterday proposed to increase monthly financial grants for gallantry award winning freedom fighters by at least sixty times.

The proposal for Bir Shreshtha is Tk 12,000 from Tk 200, Bir Uttam is Tk 10,000 from Tk 150, Bir Bikram is Tk 8,000 from Tk 125 and Bir Pratik is Tk 6,000 from Tk 100, said a meeting source.

Some army personnel were mistakenly conferred awards like Bir Bikram, Bir Uttam and Bir Pratik, for their outstanding performance in fighting insurgents in Chittagong Hill Tracks, said the source.

Though these awards will not be cancelled, these would no longer be conferred while the hike would not be the same, added the source. These army personnel conferred with Bir Uttam award

will receive Tk 4,000, Bir Bikram will receive Tk 3,000 and Bir Pratik will receive Tk 2,000 each every month, he said.

If the award winner dies, his family members will receive the grant, added the source.

Four more award categories were proposed -- Bir Sarbuttam, Bir Mrittunjoyee, Bir Chiranjib and Bir Durjoy -for outstanding performance in wars declared (if necessary) by the government, he said. Six other monthly award categories for army personnel

were proposed -- Sena Bahini Padak, Osamannya Seba Padak, Bishista Seba Padak, Shena Gaurab Padak, Sena Utkarsha Padak and Sena Parodarshi Padak, he added. For police, Border Guard Bangladesh, Ansar and Coast

Guard, Bangladesh Police Padak, President Police Padak, Bangladesh Police Padak Seba and President Police Padak Seba were proposed, he said. Planning Minister AK Khandaker, Home Minister

Shahara Khatun and high officials of the forces and the min-

istries concerned attended.
