# Railway secy, 18 others made OSD

The communications ministry also issued an order transferring six staff of : Roads and Highways Department and one from Bangladesh Road Transport : Authority, posted at the head office in Dhaka, to outside Dhaka.

The steps were taken following a recent spree of media reports about corruption in the ministry.

Just a week after Ebadat was promoted, he was made OSD by the Ministry of Public Administration following recommendation of the communications ministry, officials said. It was not known why Ebadat was made OSD but communications ministry sources claimed that he was not performing well.

The court rejected Sayedee's petition for his acquittal from the case.

Judge Mohammad Mozammel Hossain of the Special Judge's Court-3 fixed October 24 for the trial of the case.

Sayedee pleaded not guilty and sought justice from the court, after the charges were read out to him.

Masuma Khatun, deputy tax commissioner of the National Board of Revenue (NBR), filed the case on August 19 last year against him for evading tax of Tk 56.45 lakh on his income for the fiscal years from 2005-2006 to 2009-2010.


