



new project on Partition

After having brought on the big screen stories on Liberation war and contemporary socio-political issues like plight of ethnic minority groups in Chittagong Hill Tracts, women in garment factories and stranded Biharis, director Tanvir Mokammel has now set his eyes on travelling back in time to make a mega documentary on the partition of eastern part of the sub-continent.

"I have decided to make a documentary on the 1947 Partition, the riots and the human and socio-economic dislocation the event had caused on both sides of the border," Mokammel told The Daily Star.

The proposed film will have six to seven characters drawn from both sides of the border spanning across generations to talk about the partition and how they looked at it, he said.

It will have a lot of archival video footages of the events leading to the partition, the partition itself and its after-effects on human life on both sides of Bengal," said Mokammel -- now here in connection with the editing of his forthcoming epic documentary on the Liberation War of Bangladesh which is expected to hit the theatres in December this year to mark the 40th anniversary of the epoch-making event.

The documentary on the partition, the director shares, will feature interviews of leading sociologists, economists and writers from Poschim Bongo (West Bengal) and Bangladesh who have written extensively whether in the form of fiction or research on the 1947 division of the sub-continent and its impact.

Mokammel and his team plan to travel in different parts of Bangladesh as well as India particularly, Poschim Bongo, Delhi, Bihar and Dandakaranya where thousands who had migrated before and after the partition to talk to the people who had to leave their home and hearth after the catastrophic events of 1947.

"The main purpose of the documentary is to tell generations, who have not even seen the Liberation War, about the events of 1947," said Mokammel.

The work on the planned documentary will go on side by side with the director's next feature film project "Jibon Dhuli" (Jibon the Drummer), based on the story of how a Hindu drummer fails to cross over India during the Pakistan army's crackdown in 1971, loses his entire family to the brutalities and how he is forced by razakars to beat the drum to celebrate attacks on the house of innocent civilians and freedom fighters during the war.

"Jibon Dhuli", which will feature some totally new faces, will be shot in and around the rural settings of Khulna, the director's home district, and Bagerhat, said

Meanwhile, Mokammel was in Delhi for about two weeks to take forward the editing of his mega documentary on the Liberation War along with his editor Mahadeb Shil. The director said that he will return to Delhi in November this year to wrap up the editing. The duration of the documentary on the Liberation War is expected to be around four

It may be mentioned that this is going to be Mokammel's major documentary project since his previous one "Smriti Ekattor", made in early 1990s, which did not get censor clearance.




Memorabilia of Shah Abdul Karim.

The two-day children's theatre festival and competition ended here recently.






