Atletico outclass Celtic

A young Tottenham side held PAOK Salonika to a scoreless draw Thursday as fellow British sides struggled to make a significant impact on the first night of Europa League group action.

While Fulham drew 1-1 with Dutch side FC Twente and Stoke came seconds away from pulling off the shock of the night in a 1-1 draw away to Dynamo Kiev, Scottish side Celtic fell to a 2-0 defeat at Atletico Madrid.

Celtic's entry to this year's competition, only confirmed on Wednesday when Swiss club FC Sion's UEFA ban for using ineligible players was confirmed, started disastrously.

In the second minute Diego's cross was met by Colombian striker Radamel Falcao and he bulletted his header from 10 yards past Hoops goalkeeper Fraser Forster.

After spending much of the first period in their own half, Celtic made attempts to take the game to the Spaniards after the interval. Charlie Mulgrew's free kick from 20 yards out on 66 minutes was the closest they got to a goal.

Two minutes later, Celtic were punished for slack marking in the area when Diego coolly first-timed a cut-back from the byline to beat Forster with ease.

Spurs, who play Liverpool on Sunday in the Premier League, made 10 changes to their side and that decision

looked questionable as the Greeks piled on the pressure in a lively second half.

PAOK could have gone 1-0 up just after the half hour mark after Carlo Cudicini tripped Stefanos Athanasiadis inside the Spurs box.

But after Lino converted the spot-kick, the Brazilian defender was forced to retake the spot-kick. Luckily for Spurs, Lino dragged his second attempt wide.

Roman Pavlyuchenko's fierce drive, which brushed the top netting of Dario Kresic's goal, was Spurs' best chance of the half.

Athanasiadis then failed to convert a superb chance after slipping past Sebastien Bassong and Vedran Corluka on 67 minutes.

Spurs escaped 10 minutes later when Cudicini had to scramble across goal to tip Pablo Garcia's low drive wide.

In a tense finish Athanasiadis saw his shot parried by Cudicini, and the Italian did brilliantly to block down low to deny the forward a winner thanks to an acrobatic volley.

Fulham have been unbeaten in 20 European home games, stretching back to their European debut -- a 0-0 UEFA Intertoto Cup draw against FC Haka in 2002.

They took a 19th minute lead at Craven Cottage thanks to Andrew Johnson, however in a lively encounter the Premier League side were pegged back by a 41st-minute equaliser courtesy of striker Luuk De Jong.

Chelsea plot MU fall

Chelsea are determined to bring Manchester United's electrifying start to the season to a juddering halt on Sunday as the Premier League rivals collide in a heavyweight clash at Old Trafford.

The Londoners travel to Manchester as underdogs having already suffered three crucial defeats against Sir Alex Ferguson's men this year, losing in both the league and Champions League at the tail-end of last season.

As if their poor recent record wasn't daunting enough, Chelsea are also facing a United side who have started the season in dazzling form, racking up four consecutive wins and notching an unprecedented 18 goals.

Chelsea know only too well however that early season appearances can be misleading, pointing to the club's blistering start last year, when they notched 17 goals in four wins before enduring a slump which scuppered their challenge.

"United started very well this season but, if you remember, we started last season the same," Chelsea defender Branislav Ivanovic said.

"They've improved as a group but we have our aim, we have our idea and we try to use this on the pitch."

"It's going to be the hardest game for us until now and we have to show more than 100% of our power."

Ivanovic played in all three of the defeats suffered by Chelsea against United last season, which included two comprehensive losses in Manchester.

However the Serbian centre-half insists Chelsea, who can go top if they win on Sunday, will not take any psychological scars to Old Trafford.

"Last season was a different situation because we had to win there, and when you

play a big game away and you have to win, psychologically, it's completely different," he said.

"It's the first big, big test for our team, how we've improved, and we're going there trying to show our best football and to take a good result."

Ivanovic and the Chelsea back four's biggest challenge will be finding a way to shackle Wayne Rooney, the marauding England striker who heads into the game on the back of consecutive hat-tricks.

"He scored a lot of goals and we'll try to stop him," Ivanovic said.

Ferguson meanwhile plans to recall goalkeeper David de Gea and Ashley Young for the clash after resting both in the 1-1 draw at Benfica on Wednesday.

"David De Gea will play on Sunday. That was the understanding we had before the Benfica game and it doesn't change," Ferguson said.

Elsewhere this weekend, Manchester City will aim to keep pace with United at the top of the table as they travel to Craven Cottage to face a Fulham side still looking for their first win of the season.

Liverpool meanwhile head to White Hart Lane to face Tottenham, expected to be one of the Merseysiders main rivals for a top four spot this season.

Reds boss Kenny Dalglish was left seething after last weekend's defeat at Stoke, claiming the club were being unduly penalised by match officials.

However Dalglish's mood has softened after a meeting with referees' chief Mike Riley at the club's Melwood training ground this week.

"It was good to see Mike and we had an extremely informative and amicable discussion, which has given us all a better understanding of how things operate," Dalglish said.

"We will continue to conduct ourselves in a dignified and respectful manner at all times."

Sergio rejects Diego broadside
