Roadside trees often fall prey to roadblocks

Frequent road blockade in Dinajpur and Joypurhat districts has emerged as a serious threat to the roadside trees that are often felled to put up barricades on national and regional highways.

There have been 37 reported incidents of roadblock in Dinajpur and 12 in Joypurhat district since January this year as locals often resort to such programmes to realise their demands and protest against crimes and road accidents.

Road blockade causes immense sufferings to the commuters while a section of people in the name of protest loot roadside trees belonging to forest and roads and highways departments, said police and officials of the two departments in Dinajpur and Joypurhat.

On September 1, villagers of Ramdubimore area on Dinajpur-Rangpur highway blocked the road for five hours protesting a road accident that killed an elderly woman and her granddaughter.

During the blockade, the villagers axed at

least 75 road trees of Dinajpur Forest peopler5egardingthematter. Department, sources said.

On September 13, villagers of Anandasagar under Dinajpur Sadar upazila blocked Dinajpur-Dhaka highway for three hours demanding cancellation of the decision of police to conduct post mortem of a girl who committed suicide early that day.

The same day, residents of Gopalganj under Dinajpur Sadar upazila blocked Dinajpur-Dhaka highway for four hours demanding a speed breaker after a minor road accident.

Kashipur of Dinajpur Sadar upazila cut down three giant trees on Dinajpur-Dhaka highway and blocked vehicular traffic for 18 hours protesting murder of a minor boy of the village. In the face of rising incidents of roadblock,

Dinajpur Deputy Commissioner Md Jamal Uddin recently made an appeal to the people to shun the practice as it causes public sufferings.

The appeal, however, seems to have made little impact.

"Roadblock programmes are reflective of poor governance. Common people have begun to feel that they would not get justice without disruptive activities," said social worker Rezaur Rahman Rezu, also general secretary of Dinajpur unit of Udichi.

"The government should improve the remedy system if they want to prevent such aggressive reactions from people. It is ironical that common themselves become sufferers due to road blockades," Mukur Chowdhury, general secretary of In another incident last month, villagers of Dinajpur district BNP, said.

Police rarely register cases against those responsible for blocking roads.

"In most cases police cannot take any action against those who resort to road blockade or such illegal means at the beginning. However, in many cases, roadblocks continue for a brief period and the agitators lift the blockade after persuasion," said Md Moinul Islam, superintendent of police of Dinajpur.

SITUATION WORSENS AT KMCH

Patients suffer as rival doctors lock horns

Avolatile situation is prevailing at Khulna Medical College and Hospital (KMCH) as a group of students of the medical college locked the office of Superintendent Dr Kazi Hamid Asgar yesterday morningdemandinghis removal.

The students, backed by a faction of the KMCH unit of Swadhinata Chikitshak Parishad (SCP), were also staging sit-in on the campus as offiling of this report at 5:00pm.

They said the sit-in will continue until the

superintendent is removed as he, what they said, failed to resolve the crisis created at the hospital following untoward incidents occurred on the campus on Wednesday and Thursday. On Wednesday, two groups of Swadhinata

Chikitshak Parisahd (SCP) scuffled over selection of the chief guest at a function for installation of a most modern Endoscopy machine for gastroenterology department of the KMCH. Police intervened and brought the situation under control.

As a sequel to the incident, the physicians loyal to Dr Sheikh Baharul Alam, president of the Khulna unit of SCP and central vice president of Bangladesh Medical Association, (BMA) on Thursday assaulted KMCH Superintendent Dr Kazi Hamid Asgar as his supporters opposed the name of Dr Baharul Alam as chief guest of the function at Wednesday's meeting of SCP.

The SCP faction led by Dr Baharul Alam began a three-hour work stoppage yesterday

demanding removal of the superintendent.

As two rival groups of physicians are now locked in agitation and mud slinging against each other, 23 patients of general ward have already left the hospital out of panic.

On the other hand, general employees of KMCH fuelled the tense situation announcing agitation programme demanding removal and punishment of four doctors who are inciting doctors and students to create unrest at the hospital demanding removal of Superintendent Dr Kazi Hamid Asgar who is also holding the charge of acting Principal of Khulna Medical College.

The brought out a silent procession in the hospital compound at 9:30 am yesterday under the banner of KMCH Employees' Union demanding an immediate end to politicisation of KMCH and KMC administration.

KMCH Workers' Union President Sharifuzzaman Biju yesterday alleged that four doctors -- SCP Khulna unit President Dr Sheikh Baharul Alam, Assistant Registrar of Medicine Ward Dr Jewel Krishna Shur, Dr Bishnupada Saha and Dr Rabiul Alam--are creating unrest in their bid to politicise the administration under banner of Swadhinata Chikitshak Parishad (SCP).

Contacted, Superintendent Dr Asgar said he has applied for leave on health ground until September 21. I will seek extension of my leave by another week if KMCH situation does not improve, he added.

Abducted girl rescued

A teenage school student, who was abducted by criminals from Singa Eidgah point in Kalaroa upazila on August 31, was rescued by police from a house at Atulia village in Shyamnagar upazila on Friday. Victim's uncle Osman Gani of Singa village filed a case accusing six people. The accused are Abdus Salam Nikari, Rashid Biswas, Idris Ali, Mukul, Asadul Haque and Motaleb of Sonabaria village in the same upazila. Quoting local people police said the girl, a class seven student of Singa High School, was abducted by the accused while she was going to her relative's house at the same village. Acting on a tip-off, a police team led by sub-inspector (SI) Tarak Biswas of Kalaroa police station raided the house of Deshamt Gazi at Atulia village and rescued her on Friday night.

Two electrocuted

Two people were electrocuted in Hatibandha and Lalmonirhat Sadar upazilas in the district on Friday night. They were identified as Sultan Hossain, 40, son of late Farhad Hossain of Saptna Bazar village in Lalmonirhat municipality and Montez Ali,35, son of Abder Hossain of Goddimari village in Hatibandha upazila. Police and locals said, Sultan was electrocuted in his workplace "Dhaka Workshop" at BDR Hat Road in the town at around 8.45 pm while Montez was electrocuted in his house at around 9:00 pm on Friday.

Three jailed for selling hemp

A mobile court on Friday convicted three people, including a Jubo League leader, from Isapur village in Ramganj upazila and sentenced them to six months imprisonment each for selling hemp. The convicts were identified as Fazlul Haque, 40, Jubo League Isapur union unit president, activist Sharif, 35, and Hossain, 40, of the village. Acting on secret information, a team of Ramganj police team raided the village and arrested them when they were selling the contraband item. Later, the mobile court led by executive magistrate Masud Alam Siddique handed down the verdict.

CHUNNU MURDER IN MANIKGANJ

Accused threaten witnesses 2 nurses of MNH project

The accused in the sensational Chunnu murder case are allegedly asking the witnesses to keep away from court and also threatening them with death.

Chunnu Mia, 32, son of Akmat Ali of Borundi village in Hatipara union of Manikganj Sadar upazila, was killed by a gang on the night of September 3 in 2007.

While talking to this correspondent at Borundi village last week, family members said the accused, now on bail, have asked the witnesses not to give their depositions before the court and also threatened them with death.

Chunnu's body was found at Sonakanda under Keraniganj upazila of Dhaka district at around 9:20pm on

September 6 in 2007. Abdur Razzak, elder brother of the victim, filed a a murder case with Manikganj Sadar Police Station on September 8.

After filing of the case, police arrested ten people from Borundi area and produced them to a court that sent them to jail. Gour Rajbangshi, 40, one of the arrestees, gave his confessional statement before

Senior Judicial Magistrate Dilruba Sultana or November 11 in 2007.

On December 7 in 2007, Sub-Inspector Mohammad Daud, also the investigating officer (IO) of the case, submitted charge sheet to the Chief Judicial Magistrate's Court in Manikganj against nine people. The IO dropped the name of one of the arrestees as his involvement in the killing could not be found during investigation.

The accused released on bail at different times. After getting bail on May 27 in 2009 four of the accused --Azizur Rahman Lablu, Gour Rajbangshi, Azad Biswas and Awlad Hossain--asked Md Mizanur Rahman, one of the witnesses, not to give his statement before the court. They also gave him death threat.

Bodies of three people were recovered in Narayanganj, Comilla and Habiganj districts on Friday.
