Meanwhile, the authorities yesterday closed Mahbubur Rahman, officer-in-charge of Savar Police Station, to the office of superintendent of police of Dhaka district. Sub-inspectors Hares Shikder and Anwar Hossain were also suspended.

The two SIs were closed on September 10 along with six constables, three days after a judicial probe committee in its enquiry disclosed that the victims were innocent and blamed their death to the negligence in police duties.

The eight cops reached the spot while on patrol duty that night.

Dhaka district SP Mizanur Rahman said the action was taken following

the recommendation of the police probe body. After a two-month enquiry, the committee submitted its report to the police headquarters on Sunday.

A departmental case has also been filed against OC Mahbub and the eight cops for taking further action against them, added the SP.

The OC said he was closed for his alleged failure to maintain law and order in Aminbazar and Bardeshi village. He claimed himself to be a victim of the situation emerged after the death of the students.

According to the police probe report, several recent robbery incidents in the area made the locals furious.

"Although a case was filed earlier for robbery at a

house in Bardeshi village, the OC failed to take proper action. This angered the villagers against robbers and ultimately resulted in the death of six students," said a member of the investigation committee.

The probe did not find any proof of robbery there that night, although local sand trader Abdul Malek filed a robbery case with Savar police, he mentioned.

Malek claimed the six dead were robbers and four of them extorted Tk 5,000 from him earlier that night.

Al Amin, an accused in the case, is on bail.

The law enforcers filed a murder case against about 600 unidentified villagers.

Criminal Investigation Department is now investigating both the cases.

COUNTER-TERROR OPERATION British police arrest seven

British police said yesterday they had arrested six men and a woman in Birmingham as part of a major pre-planned counter-terrorism operation targeting Islamic extremists.

The men, aged between 25 and 32, were detained by unarmed officers on suspicion of the commission, preparation or instigation of an act of terrorism in Britain, West Midlands Police said in a statement.

Police sources said the operation targeted Islamists.

Unarmed officers arrested the suspects at or close to their homes in Britain's second biggest city between 11:30 pm (2230 GMT) on Sunday and 01:00 am yesterday, it said.

distinction for people's legitimate struggle for independence from foreign occupation should be concluded early was also in her suggestions.

In the agenda of the UN, national capacity building and training of Counter Terrorism personnel of developing countries and the LDCs like Bangladesh should remain high. She also recommended that there should be an International Center for Counter-Terrorism, with a complete global database on terrorist outfits and suspects for coordination and intelligence sharing amongst states.

The root causes of terrorism must be addressed and solution should be found, as well as respect for Human

Rights and Rule of Law must remain high were also included her proposal.

Hasina said Bangladesh believes that the UN is the only legitimate multilateral body capable of coordinating global action against terrorism. Bangladesh has full faith in all institutions of the UN.

The prime minister said terrorists do not belong to any race, religion, ethnicity, or nationality, and no single country can ever succeed in combating terrorism and its global outreach and financing.

"Let us make a fresh vow to save our children and future generations from the horror of terrorism and killing of innocent human beings," she called upon all the leaders of the world over to involve the whole of

humanity in the fight against terrorism.

She informed that Bangladesh has also banned all terrorist groups black-listed by the 1267 Committee and is keeping a close eye on any suspicious activity.

The prime minister said, the present government enacted Bangladesh's first Anti-Terrorism Act in 2009 and updated it in 2011 to bring it up to the global standards.

"Even our Imams or religious leaders are playing an active role with the media in raising awareness against terrorism and religious extremism," she mentioned.

Hasina said Bangladesh will continue to promote democracy, secularism, free media, as well as interfaith and intercultural tolerance. Bangladesh has not experienced any act of terrorism in the country since she took over as Prime Minister, two and a half years ago, partly due to the pursuit of these pragmatic policies, she added.

She lauded US Secretary of State Hillary Clinton for her pioneering role in ensuring her country's engagement in countering terrorism globally.

An HC vacation bench ordered the health secretary to immediately form a national enquiry committee to probe the reported incidents of illegal kidney transplantation and trade and submit a report to it within 15 days.

It also asked the government to ensure strict enforcement of the Human

Organ Transplantation Act, 1999 to stop the illegal trade.

According to the law, organs can only be transplanted if it is donated by a close kin or if donated prior to someone's death. It states that one cannot under any circumstance receive money in exchange for organs.

The law also stipulates that organ trade is illegal and

a punishable offence. A convict can be imprisoned for three to seven years and fined Tk 3 lakh for violating the law.

The rights body yesterday filed the petition with the HC bench of Justice Salma Masud Chowdhury and Justice Nazrul Islam Talukder as a public interest litigation following recent media reports on the illegal organ transplantation and trade.

A mafia gang and some corrupt doctors are involved in the illegal trade, petitioner's counsels Sigma Huda and Ruhul Quddus Kazal told the court.

Some of the arrested kidney traders have confessed the involvement of several corrupt doctors in the crime, added the counsels.

The government authorities concerned have failed to protect the fundamental rights of the people whose kidneys have been illegally sold and transplanted, they argued.

The dispatch said Quader sought to meet Moriarty to vent his pent-up anger over the initial weeks of Hasina's government.

The US embassy in the cable said one of the main architects of Bangladesh's return to democratic government expressed concern over early actions by Hasina's government that began its journey on January 6, 2009.

Quader, a retired major general, said the Awami League-led government's relations with the military appeared better than expected. He said Hasina's government had a less cavalier attitude toward Bangladesh's endemic corruption.

"Quader urged the US Government to use its influence to encourage Hasina to bring about meaningful democratic reform," the cable said.

It read Quader played a leading role in holding negotiations between Bangladesh's two major political parties -- AL and BNP -- and a wary military for a return to democratic government.

Discussions with AL President Sheikh Hasina and BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia over continuing reforms for good governance comprised a key component of

the negotiations that led to the December 29 parliamentary elections.

He said the last army-backed caretaker government had "taken great care to keep honest."

The former adviser said, "The promotion of Awami League supporters created an air of despondency [and] despair within the bureaucracy, and he gave specific examples of senior bureaucrats he highly regarded who were shunted aside by the new administration."

The cable read: "Quader said Sheikh Hasina was not yet abiding by some of the many understandings reached during meetings with the caretaker government before the elections."

"To show how detailed the pre-election discussions were," Quader produced lengthy notes from one meeting for the ambassador to examine.

"For example, Quader said he had asked Hasina to choose a finance minister from outside the party should the Awami League form the new government. He said she even mentioned a specific name -- a Bangladeshi living in America -- but ultimately chose AMA Muhith, who ran for parliament on the Awami League ticket," the cable said.

He also blasted other senior appointments,

including the new head of the Telephone Regulatory Commission "whom he described as having no qualifications for the post."

The former adviser said he believed Hasina negotiated with the caretaker government in good faith and remained sincere about improving governance.

He blamed "the new administration's missteps on Hasina underlings such as adviser HT Imam, who he said was responsible for the politicisation of the bureaucracy," the cable said.

However, Quader still saw some silver linings in his generally dark analysis. For starters, he said official attitudes toward fighting corruption appeared to have changed for the better.

He noted that Hasina had filed a personal wealth statement and that big contracts, traditionally prime targets for graft, were being handled cautiously. Another positive sign was stable relations between the new government and the military.

He said many military leaders had remained concerned that "a return to democracy would unleash a campaign of retribution because of the active army role in trying to oust Sheikh Hasina, Khaleda Zia and many of their top lieutenants from politics," reads the cable.

For all the problems, Quader said he believed the political situation would have been even worse without Hasina, whom he described as "the best bet among Bangladeshi politicians to lead the country."

"She wants to change for the better. But she is unclear how to do it," the cable said quoting Quader.

The former adviser predicted "the next five years would be better than the inept and kleptocratic BNP rule of 2001-2006."

Syrian security forces kill 5 in Homs

Syria's security forces opened fire yesterday during a raid on political dissidents in the town of Houla in central Homs province, a flashpoint in the months-long anti-regime uprising, activists said.

"Five residents, including a woman, were shot dead yesterday by security forces, who have been conducting a sweep in Houla since Sunday," the Syrian Observatory for Human Rights said in a statement.

The forces conducted a campaign of arrests in Aleppo, the country's second-largest city.
