4 killed in N'ganj road crash

Four people, including a father and his son, were killed and seven others injured when a bus collided head-on with a CNG-run auto-rickshaw in Siddhirganj of Narayanganj yesterday morning.

The deceased--Badal Mia, 45, his son Hira Mia, 18, Sulota Biswas, 42, and auto-rickshaw.

Witnesses said a passenger bus of Hospital. Komol Paribahan rammed the oncoming three-wheeler head-on around 8:00am at Sailo in the upazila, leaving Badal dead on the spot and 10 others seriously injured.

Two commit suicide

A housewife and a teenage female domestic help committed suicide at Pallabi and Rampura in the city yesterday.

Shahinur Begum, 20, wife of electrician Mohammad Shamim of Rupnagar area, hanged herself from a ceiling fan around 1:00pm in her residence.

She was rushed to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) where the on-duty doctor declared her dead, Shahinur's mother-inlaw Jayeda Begum told reporters.

Police arrested Shamim from DMCH.

Meanwhile, police recovered hanging body of a domestic help in city's Rampura area on Monday night.

Deceased Champa Akhter, 14, has been working in the residence of bank official Jahid Mahmood Khan of West Rampura for last two months.

Police said they recovered the body from the balcony after breaking open the door of her master's residence around 10:00pm.

Jahid and his wife who were outside the residence found the door locked from inside and called police.

The BCL leaders alleged that the main opposition BNP backed Jamaat to carry out the rampage.

The student body also rallied at Jagannath University demanding punishment to the rioters.

Sammilito Samajik Andolan, Shamprodaiykota-Jongibad Birodhi Mancha, Sammilito Sangskritik Jote, and Bangabandhu Adorsha Forum condemned and protested the violence through press statements. Meanwhile, Bangladesh Jatiya Party

(BJP) Chairman Andaliv Rahman and Secretary General Shamim Al Mamun in a press release protested "police action" on Jamaat men, saying police attacked Jamaat men when they tried to bring out peaceful during demonstration that exploded into procession in the city on Monday.

Pry terminal exams from Nov 23

Terminal examinations, 2011 of the primary level students under general and madrasa education would begin November 23 instead of the earlier fixed November 16. The national steering committee on the

examinations yesterday in a meeting decided to postpone the examinations by a week since it was coinciding with the Junior School Certificate (JSC) and Junior Dakhil Certificate (JDC) examinations from November 1-21.

The meeting, held at primary and mass education ministry with its minister Afsarul Ameen in the chair, also decided that the examination results would be published in the grading system and that the students with physical challenges will get 15 minutes extra time during the examination. Primary and Mass Education Secretary


AKM Abdul Awal Majumder said manpower

More than 19 lakh general primary and madrasa students took part in the examination last year and around 17.91 lakh of them passed.
