Teesta dyke collapses flooding seven villages in Rangpur

A Teesta river embankment in Gannarpar area under Gangachara upazila of Rangpur district collapsed yesterday morning, flooding seven villages and aman paddy fields.

Meanwhile, flood situa-

tion in five upazilas of Lalmonirhat district further worsened as fresh areas went under water yesterday.

A correspondent quoted local people of Gannarpar area in Gangachara upazila as saying that the embankment collapsed at around 11:00am due to heavy pressure of water as the Teesta continued to swell.

Sources in the Water Development Board (WDB) said the water level in the Teesta marked a further rise yesterday and the river was flowing 4 centimetres above its danger mark.

Gangachara Sadar Union

Parishad Chairman Asaduzzaman said the dyke, built by Water Development Board, collapsed during last year's flood. Local people repaired the dyke through voluntary service to protect around 10 thousand people living along the riverside in

the upazila, he added.

He further said local people urged the Water Development Board to build a spur to protect the embankment, but the board did not do the job on the plea of fund shortage.

Contacted, Executive Engineer Anwar Hossain of Rangpur WDB said they could not repair the dyke due to shortage of fund. He said the authorities concerned will sanction money this year to repair the embankment.

a spur at Gannapar point was not justified, the engineer said, adding that if they build a spur there a vast tract of land will be eroded at Haragachh point. Our Lalmonirhat corre-

spondent reported that with inundation of fresh areas along the Teesta and Dharla rivers, the flood situation in the district furtherworsenedyesterday.

The flood-hit upazilas are Hatibandha, Kaliganj, Aditmari, Patgram and Sadar upazilas.

Over 75 thousand people at 60 villages in 13 unions of the upazilas have been marooned due to flash flood caused by heavy downpour and swelling Teesta and Dharla rivers.

According to Lalmonirhat WDB sources, Teesta was flowing 4 centtimetres above its danger level at Dowani point in Hatibandha upazila

while Dharla was flowing two centimeters below its danger level at Kulaghat point in Lalmonirhat Sadar upazila yesterday morning.

Affected farmers claimed aman paddy on 2,000 hectares of land has gone underwater in 13 unions while Deputy Director (DD) of district agriculture extension department Abdul Mozid said aman paddy on a total of 1200 hectares of land is now under flood water. Of the total land, 900

hectares are in Hatibandha upazila, 250 hectares in The demand for building Aditmari upazila and 50 hectares in Kaliganj upazila, he added. If foodwater does not recede

in a day or two, aman plants will get damaged and farmer will face heavy losses, he said.

In Joypurhat, flash flood caused by heavy downpour marooned at least 25,000 people in different upazilas of Joypurhat district yesterday, reports UNB. Aman paddy fields in the

low-lying areas of Sadar, Panchbibi, Akkelpur and Khetlal upazilas have gone under water. Sources in the Department

of Agricultural Extension said aman paddy on 500 hectares of land is now under flood water in the four upazilas. The worst affected areas

are Rangta Choudhripara, Khomaripara, Mahmudpur, Ghonapara, Malopara, Dharki, Shotahat, Baniapara and Monnapara.

A joint body of transport owners and workers announced an indefinite strike from today in 10 districts of Khulna division and five districts of Greater Faridpur to press home their two-point demand.

The demands are expulsion of Mir Abu Saeed from the post of president of Magura road transport owners' body and implementation of the agreement for ensuring undisturbed movement of transports of all other districts via Magura.

Convenor of the joint body Shah Alam Mukul and president of Jessore bus owners' association Md Ali Akbar said no transport would be allowed to ply from today on any road in southwestern region during the strike till the two-point demand is met.

Magura road transport owners and Khulna divisional unit of road transport owners-workers body are locked in rivalry and mud slinging over various issues, sources said. As a sequel to this rivalry,

Magura road transport owners called for a 72-hour strike with effect from today to press home their six-point demand. To counter their call the joint

body announced the indefinite

transport strike from today on all routes of 10 districts of Khulna division and five districtsofgreaterFaridpur.

Both the rival groups expressed their determination not to allow movement of transports as long as the strike continues.

Magura road transport owners alleged that the leaders of the joint body are involved in extorting money from Dhaka-bound passenger buses.

Meanwhile, Khulna divisional unit of Bangladesh Petroleum Dealers' and Petrol Pump Owners' Association observed a three- hour strike from 8:00 am to 11:00 am yesterday demanding increase in dealers' commission and fare of tank lorries.

Students of Pabna Edward College vandalised five vehicles and blocked Dhaka-Pabna highway after transport workers beat up students of the college at Chatmohar bus stand in the district yesterday morning. The students demanded

punishment of the culprits while transport workers and owners association suspended vehicular movement in Chatmohar, Bhangura and Faridpur upazilas under the district. Unruly transport workers

attacked a Pabna-bound college bus carrying the students when its driver stopped at Chatmohar bus stand for a while at about 9:00am. As the students protested, the transport workers beat

on Pabna-Chatmohar highway at Rail Bazar in Chatmohar upazila and Debottar Bazar in Atghoria upazila under the district from 10:00am to 12:00am. As the news of attack on the students reached Pabna Edward College, several hundred students blocked

Dhaka-Pabna highway at Singa Bypass intersection in Pabna town at noon. At a demonstration rally on the highway, they warned of tougher agitation programmes if the culprit transport workers are not punished.

Later the teachers of the college, student leaders and police persuaded the students to withdraw the road blockade at about 2:30pm.

Meanwhile the college administration and the district transport workers association held a meeting on the premises of Pabna Edward College but it ended inconclusively.

Our Dinajpur that students of Birganj Degree College blocked Panchagarh-Dinajpur highway demanding a speed breaker in front of the college after a college student was critically wounded in a road accident in Birganj upazila under Dinajpur district yesterday morning.

About two hours later, the students agreed to withdraw their blockade upon assurance of setting up a speed breaker there, police said.

Md Abu Tayeb, 18, a second year business management student of Birganj Degree College, got down from a bus in front of the college but a Thakurgaonbound passenger bus hit him when he was crossing the road, police said. He was rushed to Birganj Health Complex in a critical condition.
