Three people including a two-year-old girl drowned in

Kushtia, Sylhet, and Kurigram yesterday. BSS from Islamic University reports: Shamsur Rahman,

20, a student of the university in Kushtia, drowned in a

pond on the campus yesterday morning. Shamsur was the son of Belal Hossai of Keshabpur village

in Mithapur, Rangpur. He was taking bath in a pond in front of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman hall. Shamsur took admission to Al-Fikah department of the

university under the academic session 2010-11. Vice Chancellor Prof Dr M Alauddin and Pro-VC Prof Dr

Kamal Uddin condoled the death of Shamsur and conveyed deep sympathy to the victim's bereaved family members.

Staff correspondent from Sylhet says: A 32-year-old man drowned in the Piain river in Jaflong yesterday morning. The deceased, Abu Bakar Shoeb, accounts officer of a

private power plant's Dhaka office, was on a trip to Jaflong. He drowned after being driven by strong current in the river he was swimming along with some of his colleagues.

Stone workers recovered Shoeb after hour-long effort from sand stakes and sent him to Jaintapur Upazila Health Complex. The victim was declared dead at Sylhet Osmani Medical College Hospital.

Shoeb was the youngest among the four children of late Md Habibur Rahman of Uttar Bashabo of the capital.

Our Kurigram correspondent adds: A two-year-old girl drowned in a pond near her house in Kurigram town yesterday.

The victim, Raichha Parvin, daughter of Rebeka Sultana Lipi, fell in the pond while she was playing near her mother. Lipi was washing clothes in the pond during the incident.

105 PSs to bring under network by December

The on going work to bring 105 police stations under intra-computer network will be complete by December this year.

With the completion of the work, all activities including filing of cases, recording general diaries, keeping records and sharing information among the police stations through computers would begin. A central server at the police headquarters will monitor the day- to- day activities of the police stations.

"A total of 105 police stations in 16 districts from Dhaka to Cox's Bazar will be brought under intracomputer network by December this year and the work on it is almost complete," Superintendent of Police Rofiqul Hassan Ghani of Telecom told the news agency.

27,000 Durga Puja mandaps Free Shibmandir from grabbers' getting final touches

Over 27,000 mandaps (pavilion) are being erected across the country to celebrate the Durga Puja, the largest festival for Hindu Bangalees, on October 2-6.

"Construction of the most of the Puja mandaps across the country is now at the final stage to hold the annual Hindu festival, the worship of the goddess, Durga", said Nirmal Chatterjee, organising secretary of Bangladesh Puja Udjapon Parishad.

Mohanagar Sarbojaneen Puja Committee yesterday held a meeting at Dhakeswari National Temple to discuss the preparation of the city's Puja mandaps. Representatives of different Puja committees told the meeting of their preparation and problems.

Milan Kanti Datta, vice-president of Puja Udjapon Parishad, and Tapash Pal, ex-general secretary of the Mohanagar committee, among others, spoke while Ramen Mandol, organising secretary of the Mohanagar committee, moderated the meeting.

"The number of Puja mandaps in the capital has been increased to 196 this year from 191 last year", said Babul Debnath, general secretary of the Mohanagar committee.

Babul said the committee leaders took part in an inter-ministerial meeting on September 18 and expressed concern over the security threat to four Puja mandaps. "The authority concerned assured us of full-proof security for the four Puja Mandaps -- two in Sutrapur and one each in Mirpur and Azimpur -- as well as the other Puja mandaps in the city".

He also said the Mohanagar committee would set up a monitoring cell at Dhakeswari National Temple to keep tabs on the Puja mandaps during the festival. "With cooperation of the admin-



istration, the cell will try to solve the instant problems", he added.

Bangladesh Puja Udjapon Parishad will also set similar cell there to monitor the Puja mandaps across the country.

The Mohanagar committee gave some directives to the city's Puja committees, including keeping sound system switched off during Azan and prayers and run the system not after 10:00pm. It also directed to form volunteer team to ensure security of the visitors.

Expressing satisfaction over the preparation, Biresh Chandra Saha, president of Mohanagar Committee, said they have received no report of vandalism of any idol in the city as happened in the


