#### Rain spoils Mumbai tie

Heavy and unabated rain washed out an exciting contest between spirited Mumbai Indians and South African Cape Cobras in the Champions League Twenty20 at the Chinnaswamy Stadium on Friday.

With no let-up in the rain even 90 minutes after the break and prospects of play resuming ruled out, the organisers abandoned the match and awarded one point to both the teams.

Within minutes after Mumbai set a defendable target of 176 for five wickets in 20 overs, dark clouds opened up over the city centre and started pounding the stadium even as the ground staff scampered to cover the 22-yard pitch in the middle and the circular green outfield with massive tarpaulin sheets.

Earlier, Mumbai put up the formidable score after they were put in.

Starting on a blazing note, Mumbai's openers Aiden Blizzard (19) and Sarul Kanwar (45) posted a breezy 65-run first-wicket partnership in 6.3 overs, with six sixes and four fours between them before Robin Peterson had them caught, both times by English player Owais Shah in the seventh and ninth overs.

Though Cobras got rid of Ambati Rayudu quickly, James Franklin (18) and Kieron Pollard consolidated the innings and accelerated the run-rate through the middle overs with a 69-run fourth wicket partnership.

After Kanwar smashed five sixes and three fours to score 45 in 21 balls, it was the turn of Pollard to hit three massive sixes and six fours for a cameo innings of 58 in 37 balls. For Cobras, Robin Peterson took two wickets, while Dale Steyn, Jean-Paul Duminy and Kemp shared one wicket each.

#### Liu becomes a communist

China's Olympic and world 110m hurdles champion Liu Xiang has taken up a Communist Party Youth League post, as the state seeks to capitalise on the millionaire athlete's star status.

In a posting on China's Twitter-like Tencent microblog, Liu said he gave a speech at a Shanghai sports meeting Thursday as the representative of the youth league, an organisation widely seen as groom-

ing China's future leaders. According to Xinhua news agency, Liu was named deputy secretary of the Shanghai sports bureau committee of the Communist Youth League, which would make him a municipal-level official.

The report said Liu's official duties were unlikely to interfere with his training as an athlete.

China's President Hu Jintao, who reportedly joined the league at the age of 14, was chairman of the organisation in the early 1980s.

Liu became China's first track gold medallist at the 2004 Athens Olympics, set a world record of 12.88 in 2006 which remains the second fastest time in history, and went on to be crowned world champion in 2007.

## Radwanska takes Pan Pacific title

Agnieszka Radwanska kept up her immaculate winning record in finals this season by beating Vera Zvonareva of Russia to take the WTA Pan Pacific Open tennis tournament on Saturday.

The 22-year-old Pole, who claimed the title at Carlsbad in her first final of the season in August, when she also beat Zvonareva, repeated her excellent performance with a 6-3, 6-2 victory over the world number four.

"I'm really happy, because I really had tough matches here, it's very tough to play every day. I had very long matches, so I'm really happy," said Radwanska. "To play against those like Vera, you just

have to play your 100 per cent and your best tennis. I was always trying my best from the first point and actually I was very focused till the end. That's why I took the two sets.

"I was just feeling very good today and I'm happy about my performance, for sure," she

added. Radwanska shrugged off a 0-2 start, taking five games in a row as the Russian struggled to put away her first serves, hitting four double faults -- one on a break point.

Radwanska missed one set point in the eighth game and two more in the ninth, but cashed in on a fourth as the Russian hit a lob

The Pole jumped ahead 2-0 and then 4-1 in the second set and, although she dropped her serve in the sixth, she took the following two games, the match ending with the Russian hitting a forehand wide.

"It was my best tournament this year. It was a big tournament with all top players and also I had very good wins here. It means a lot for me, so I want to come back here next year," said Radwanska.

Zvonareva failed to keep back her tears when she returned to the dressing room.

"I felt like I started off really well. I was two up and had a break point [in the third game], and then something happened. I don't know what happened exactly," said Zvonareva, 27.

"It happens to everybody. I played really well on my way to the final, I started off really well, and I felt like somebody turned off the button and it was not me on the court any more."

It was Radwanska's third straight win against Zvonareva after losing their first two meetings.

It was also Radwanska's sixth career title, following victories at Pattaya City, Istanbul and Eastbourne in 2008 and Stockholm in 2007, as well as at Carlsbad.

The win brought Radwanska a winner's cheque for 360,000 dollars and she will move up to 12th in the world when the new rankings are announced next Monday.

Janko Tipsarevic saved Serbian pride on Saturday as he beat Japan's Kei Nishikori 6-4, 6-3 to set up a Malaysian Open final against Marcos Baghdatis.

Cypriot Baghdatis, who was runner-up to Roger Federer in the 2006 Australian Open final, had earlier defeated Serbia's second seed Viktor Troicki 6-3, 6-1, leaving Tipsarevic with a mission on court at the Putra Stadium

The Japanese number one made a run at another upset scenario in the wake of his semifinal defeat of top seed Nicolas Almagro, but Tipsarevic was having none of it.

The Serb closed out the victory in just under two hours as he saved all six break points he faced to nullify the Nishikori attack.

The winner improved to 43-20 on the season as he enters his third 2011 final after Delray Beach and Eastbourne, both of which he lost.

Young, who stunned Murray this year at Indian Wells but lost to him at the US Open, said he changed tactics after losing the first set against Monfils.

"I started trying to play the important points well. The first set was very physical and tough -- as was the match. But that's why you do the fitness. I'm excited with how what I've done. It's been long time coming," said the former teen prodigy.

Australian swimmer Kenrick Monk on Saturday tearfully admitted to inventing a story about how he suffered an injury which could harm his Olympic chances, revealing that he hurt himself skateboarding.

Monk broke two bones in his elbow in what he initially claimed was a hit-and-run by a car which he said deliberately drove into his bike as he made his way to training in Brisbane on Wednesday.

But the 23-year-old admitted Saturday that he had made up the story in a panic. "I was embarrassed. I didn't know what to

do, I panicked, I freaked... basically to know that I've just fallen off a skateboard, something that a 10-year-old can ride," Monk said as he choked back tears. "I was embarrassed something stupid."

Monk, whose coach Michael Bohl was by his side as he spoke to reporters, said he had agonised over his lie while recovering in hospital and eventually told his parents and police on Saturday morning. The Commonwealth Games relay gold
