# SQ Chy 'involved' in 32 war crimes

Tribunal gets today probe findings; evidence said to be found in Natun Chandra murder

Investigators have found BNP leader Salauddin Quader Chowdhury's involvement in at least 32 incidents of crimes against humanity including genocide, murder, torture, rape and abduction during the 1971 LiberationWar.

The agency investigating war crimes told journalists yesterday that it has prepared the final probe report on Salauddin's crimes against humanity.

The investigators, however, did not give any details about their find-

Preferring anonymity, one of the investigators told The Daily Star that they have found evidence that Chowdhury himself had shot dead several people including Natun


