Release of JU teacher urged

Over 100 pro-Awami League (AL) teachers, officers, staff and some students of Jahangirnagar University (JU) formed a human chain in the campus yesterday demanding immediate release of a JU lecturer arrested on Friday.

The government and politics department lecturer Mohammad Firozul Hasan and 20 others were arrested by Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) in connection with selling fake question papers for the combined medical college and dental college admission test.

Later, some students burned an effigy of Rab DG Mukhlesur Rahman in front of the administrative building.

Meanwhile, JU pro-BNP teachers alleged that JU authority is still to temporarily expel Firozul.

Nationalist Teachers Forum Chairman Prof Khandakar Mustahidur Rahman said according to university job law 10 (Ka), if any teacher is detained or if any trial is held against a teacher, he must be expelled temporarily.

On contact, JU Registrar Abu Bakr Siddique said JU authority would take a decision on receiving the court papers.

ALTERING TESTIMONY ON DU VIOLENCE

Moeen's allegation refuted

The parliamentary sub-committee probing the August 2007 violence at Dhaka University has refuted former army chief Moeen U Ahmed's allegation of altering his testimony on the event.

Moeen, a key player in the last caretaker government, in an e-mail to Rashed Khan Menon, chief of the probe body, last week said he in his testimony to the committee did not blame the then caretaker government for the violence on the university campus.

He also termed "inappropriate" the news reports done on the basis of the committee chief's press briefing.

"News items published in newspapers quoted me that I had blamed the last caretaker government for the campus violence. It is not correct. The fact is I did not tell the probe body anything blaming the then caretaker government," a source in the committee quoted from the e-mail.

Menon on Saturday said, "We are not worried about his [Moeen] claim. We had recorded his testimony on the incident." He said, "A small part of his [Moeen] testi-

standing what he said during the teleconference." Moeen on September 13 gave a testimony to the sub-committee through a

Warrant against acting Jamaat boss

Two separate courts of Dhaka issued arrest warrants yesterday against Jamaat-e-Islami Acting Ameer Maqbul Ahmad, its Dhaka City chief Rafiqul Islam Khan and nine others in cases filed for assaulting police, blocking traffic movement, and creating anarchy during the party's recent demonstration in the city.

The courts passed the orders directing officers-incharge of Paltan and Ramna police stations to submit reports on execution of the arrest warrants between October 13 and 20.

Earlier, Metropolitan Magistrate Erfan Ullah of the Speedy Trial Court-7 acknowledged the charges against 120 Jamaat leaders and activists with Ramna Police Station while Metropolitan Magistrate Asaduzzaman Nur of the Speedy Trial Court-14 acknowledged charges against 161 Jamaat men with Paltan Police Station.

Maqbul and ATM Azharul Islam were accused in charges acknowledged in both courts.

On September 19, several hundred Jamaat activists clashed with police in the capital, leaving at least 100 people injured and halting traffic for hours.

During the violence, the Jamaat men set fire to at least 28 vehicles, smashed around 200 others, and vandalised dozens of roadside shops, police said.

Her neighbour Harunur Rashid said, Saturday afternoon, Momtaz had a quarrel with her parents for not allowing her to go out with some friends.

Later at night, her father and other siblings found her room door locked from inside and they broke open the door to find her dead.

Dalits demand housing

US to give \$180m dev assistance

The US government will provide over US \$180 million to Bangladesh as development assistance this year, an increase of over US \$20 million from last year.

US Chargé d'Affaires Nicholas Dean and United States Agency for International Development (USAID) Mission Director to Bangladesh Richard Greene announced the commitment yesterday, says a press release of the American Centre in Dhaka.

Of the assistance through USAID, approximately \$13 million is allotted for democracy and governance while \$45 million for food security, \$61 million for population, health, and nutrition programmes and \$17 million for climate change and environment programmes.

Moreover, USAID will help Bangladesh government expand its clean energy programmes.

Lastly, \$42 million will go for basic humanitarian assistance, improve availability of food, increase purchasing power of poor people, improve disaster readiness and provide basic health and nutrition services to highly vulnerable people.
