



# Chumki, Khalil take honours

Shamsunnahar Chumki dethroned holder Nasmunnahar Beauty to regain the 200m sprint after eight years on the first day of the two-day Walton 11th National Summer Athletics Championship at the Bangabandhu National Stadium yesterday.

On the other hand, in the men's 200m sprint, Khalilur Rahman of Bangladesh Army retained his title with a better finish of 22.16 seconds than his teammate Azharul, who took 22.40 seconds to win bronze.

Chumki took 25.45 seconds to finish ahead of Beauty, who clocked 25.90 seconds while BKSP student Papia Rani Sarker finished third with a time of 26.27 seconds.

"I always used to falter at the last hurdle,

but over the last one year I have been training on endurance under BJMC coach Joynal Abedin and improved a lot, which helped me overcome the last hurdle well and beat Beauty," said Chumki, who last won the 200m sprint in 2003.

Chumki's male counterpart Khalil won the 200m title facing stiff competition from Azharul.

"I am much inspired after taking part in the IAAFWorld championship in Daegu and want to keep up this momentum till the next South Asian Games. I have proved myself today after winning the 200m sprint," said Khalil.

High jumper Sajib Hossain's performance suffered in comparison to the form he displayed in the national meet but he still

## MSC to bank on foreign players

Powerhouse Mohammedan Sporting Club will be banking on a legion of foreign recruits to deliver them the elusive Professional League title as they completed registering their local players on the second day of players' transfer yesterday.

The Black and Whites registered a total of 20 players, 13 of them are newcomers while the rest have remained with the club from the last edition where they finished in a poorly sixth position.

"The local players are experienced and we also have the young players who played for the club last year. We will be bringing in good foreign players to make the team a formidable one," said Mohammedan manager

foreign players to seven and number of players that can participate in a match to five. Last season, a maximum of five foreigners were allowed to be registered with a club. But the Mohammedan think-tank feels that the local star players, who are small in number, have all been scooped up by one or two big clubs like the previous season, and that is why they want to make their squad stronger by recruiting some quality foreigners.

"There is a shortage of quality players inside the country and most of them have been scooped up by one or two big clubs which is why we appealed to the league committee to increase the quota of foreigners," said Mohammedan's football chairman MA Salam.

"We will be bringing in quality players from Nigeria and maybe even from Europe so that we can compensate for the lack of local star players in the side," said Salam.

Spin legend Warne, 42, got down on one knee and popped the question in front of other diners and when Hurley agreed the couple were given a standing ovation, The Mail on Sunday and The Sunday Telegraph newspapers reported.

Pictures showed the couple smiling as they walked arm in arm across a golf course on Saturday, with Hurley, 46, wearing a large sapphire and diamond engagement ring.

They were greeted by shouts of congratulations from well-wishers as the pro-amateur Alfred Dunhill Links Championship got
