Saarc nations push for seed bank

Agriculture ministers meet in Dhaka Wednesday

Agriculture ministers of all the eight Saarc countries will meet in Dhaka on Wednesday to form Saarc Seed Bank and expedite making the Saarc Seed Bank functional.

Officials involved in preparations for the meeting told The Daily Star yesterday the proposed structure of the seed bank has been finalised, and it will be mooted at a senior officials' meeting on Tuesday.

Agriculture Minister Matia Chowdhury and Secretary of the ministry CQK Mustaq

Ahmed, both now on an official visit to Turkey, will review all aspects of the ministerial meet by Sunday.

Contacted yesterday, Additional Agriculture Secretary Anwar Faruque said, "Things have been cleared at technical committee level for the formation of a regional seed bank."

Faruque, also director general of the ministry's seed wing, hoped that with the Dhaka meet's endorsement, the planned seed bank would get approval at the Saarc summit in the Maldives next month.

The cult of Steve Jobs




7 Jamaat, Shibir men held from procession
