T&T lost in Bermuda

Trinidad and Tobago suffered a shock 2defeat to Bermuda in World Cup qualifying for the CONCACAF region on Friday while Canada romped to a 7-0 win in St. Lucia.

Trinidad, who qualified for the 2006 World Cup finals in Germany, continued their miserable decline with a loss to opponents ranked 187th in the world.

Second half goals from Antwan Russell and Nahki Wells put Bermuda 2-0 up and although Kevin Molino scored for the visitors nine minutes from the end it was too late to stop the embarrassing loss for German Otto Pfister's team. Bermuda have never made it close to qualifying for a

World Cup and indeed have never even made it to the regional CONCACAF Gold Cup. The defeat puts Trinidad at risk of failing to reach the third

round of qualifying when the major regional powers, including Mexico and the United States, join the fray. Guyana moved above Trinidad to the top of Group B after

they enjoyed a 2-0 win away to Barbados with late goals from Anthony Abrams and Chris Nurse securing the win for the Golden Jaguars. Canada enjoyed their trip to the Caribbean with Norwich

City's Simeon Jackson scoring a first half hattrick while Olivier Occean and Iain Hume scored two each in the rout. Panama enjoyed a 5-0 win at Dominica with Amir Waithe scoring twice while El Salvador were made to fight for the three points in the Dominican Republic -- a 67th minute goal

from Mark Blanco grabbing the win. The six group winners in the current second stage of qualifying go through to face the top-six ranked teams in the region in the third phase.

The top three teams at the end of the fourth phase of qualifying, involving six teams, will qualify for the 2014 World Cup finals in Brazil with the fourth placed team heading into a playoff with the top team from Oceania.

Trouble mars Euro qualifier

The Euro 2012 qualifier between Greece and Croatia was temporarily suspended less than three minutes after kickoff on Friday when over 100 masked individuals entered a stand and attacked the Croatia supporters.

The group, some wearing motorcycle helmets, threw flares and at least one petrol bomb in their direction. Some Croatia fans responded by ripping off seats and throwing them at their attackers.

Greece's Portuguese coach Fernando Santos and the team captain Giorgos Karagounis were seen signalling to that part of the stadium to try to restore calm.

The game resumed after a six-minute interruption, but the Croat supporters, said to number about 700, continued ripping seats and throwing them at riot police, who responded with pepper spray. The incident was over within minutes and there was no further trouble in the game, which Greece won 2-0.

Police are looking for a security employee who allegedly opened the gate and let the masked men inside the Karaiskakis Stadium, where the qualifier took place.

GER, ESP, NED stay perfect England qualify despite draw

Germany, Spain, Netherlands and Italy had already qualified for next year's tournament, all added points to their tallies on Friday.

The Germans made it nine wins out of nine, beating Turkey 3-1 away in Group A. RESULTS

That result meant their opponents dropped to third place, one point below Belgium who thrashed Kazakhstan 4-1 but who must now visit the Germans on Tuesday in their final game while Turkey host lowly Azerbaijan.

World and European champions Spain struck early to take all the points in Prague with a 2-0 win over Czech Republic, denting their hosts' chances of taking the runnersup spot in Group I.

The Czechs stayed second with 10 points although Scotland, two points behind, should overtake them when they visit Liechtenstein on Saturday. The Scots then travel to Spain on Tuesday with the Czechs away to Lithuania.

Netherlands secured top spot in Group E when a Klaas-Jan Huntelaar goal shortly

before halftime gave them a 1-0 win over Moldova, while Sweden made sure of second place in that group with a 2-1 victory over Finland.

Group C winners Italy took a first-minute lead with a Claudio Marchisio goal in Belgrade before Serbia fought back through Branislav Ivanovic's 26th minute effort to

snatch a 1-1 draw that kept alive the hosts' hopes of a playoff berth.

The match passed off peacefully after Serbia lost the reverse fixture in Genoa by a 3-0 walkover due to crowd trouble and the result left Vladimir Petrovic's side needing to beat Slovenia away in their last game to finish second.

Just a point separates leaders France and Bosnia in Group D after the former beat Albania 3-0

and the latter thumped Luxembourg 5-0 to set up a mouth-watering shootout between the top two next week. Travel plans are also not certain for the

Cyprus 4-1 and Portugal beat Iceland 5-3. That left the Danes and Portuguese level at the top on 16 points with the two meet-

Rooney sees red

Fabio Capello is preparing for life without Wayne Rooney after the striker's dismissal marred England's successful qualification for Euro 2012.

Rooney was shown a straight red card for violent conduct after aiming a needless and petulant kick at Montenegrin defender Miodrag Dzudovic during England's 2-2 draw at the Gradski Stadium on Friday.

Rooney's sending off capped a miserable week for the player following the arrest on Thursday of his father and uncle in connection with allegations of a football betting

But more seriously for Capello, Rooney's moment of madness means England will kick off their campaign in Poland and Ukraine next summer with their most important player serving a suspension.

Rooney's red card also reopens all the old question marks about the striker's temperament, echoing his 2006 World Cup quarterfinal dismissal for a similarly reckless foul on Portugal's Ricardo Carvalho.

An unhappy Capello said Rooney had been guilty of a "silly" mistake, and revealed Friday that he plans to use next month's friendly against world champions Spain at Wembley as an opportunity to plan for the player's absence.

"I think all the players are important. But we will find the solution to play without him. We will try something the next game, the next friendly game that we play," the Italian said. Capello however defended his decision to

concerning his relatives had emerged.

"(Rooney) made a silly mistake when he kicked the opponent. And he will not play the first match of the Euros because he'll be suspended," Capello said.

"He was not happy because he missed some control and some passes and I think it was for this reason that he kicked the opponent."

Capello admitted however that Rooney's behaviour was indefensible.

"It's a red card. I can't defend that. I'm not happy. Absolutely. I spoke with him, he made a silly mistake. He said 'yes, sorry'," Capello said.

"He's a really important player, he's got a lot of experience, he's played a lot of important games. But it was a silly mistake. What can you do?

"I've seen really important players make silly mistakes before. At that moment you can't understand why this happened."

And a clearly exasperated Capello admitted he was powerless to rein in Rooney's temperament once a match got under way.

"I can speak with him before, but there is nothing I can do when he's playing the play Rooney, just a day after the allegations game," he said.
