BRAHMAPUTRA China won't divert water

China rejects speculations of diverting water of common river Brahmaputra (Yarlung Tsangpo) from its side, citing "possible impact" on relations with neighbouring India and Bangladesh and the environment.

Govt finally goes for cracks repair

The government is finally set to start the repair work on Bangabandhu Multipurpose Bridge late next month, five years after receiving expert recommendation.

The repairs will commence after mapping of cracks on the deck is done later this month, said Liaquat Ali, an executive engineer of the Bridges Division.

The authorities in May picked China Communication Construction Company for the Tk 243 crore job including replacement of the outdated expansion joints of the bridge. The firm will complete the work within a year.

Sophisticated methods and materials will be used to fix the defects. A type of

glue will be used to repair cracks while a spray will be applied to smaller cracks to make those waterproof. Polymer will be pasted on the cracks to make sure no crack develops there in future.

Finally, the entire deck of the bridge will be carpeted with two inches of asphalt, mentioned Liaquat Ali.

A three-member expert committee led by Prof Jamilur Reza Chowdhury will moni tor the repair work.

South Korean Hyundai Engineering and Construction Co Ltd constructed the 4.8 kilometre long rail-road bridge at a cost of Tk 4,000 crore. It was opened to public in 1998.

A team of experts in 2006 detected numerous cracks on its deck and asked



Mumbai and other metros of India yesterday were put on high alert after large quantities of explosive were found outside a railway station in Ambala, Haryana on Thursday.

Following the alert, security has been stepped up in all the metros. There's tight security at vital installations and police have been asked to carry out surprise checks.

About five kilos of RDX, two timers and five detonators were found in a car parked outside the Ambala Cantonment railway station on Thursday morning. Intelligence sources said the RDX was not yet in IED (Improvised Explosive Detonator) form; it was not connected to any detonator or timer and so the car seemed to have been a carriage vehicle

bound for a terror attack.

Police later said the large quantity of explosives recovered from a car was meant to be used in an attack by militants on Delhi.

Delhi police official Arun Kampani told reporters they had received intelligence that Lashkar-e-Taiba militants in Indianadministered Kashmir had planned to "strike in Delhi" with the help of the Babbar Khalsa International (BKI), a group said to be active in Indian Punjab.

They said the attack was timed ahead of the upcoming Diwali festival.

Sixteen people were killed and 76 others were injured in a bomb attack on the high court in Delhi last month.

"Investigations found that the explosives were meant for BKI and to be used in Delhi," Kampani said.

Sangu reserve to be known in 10-12 days

Says Santos official as offshore drilling for gas continues

Australia-based Santos, which is drilling a well in the Bay of Bengal for gas, said it has to wait another 10 to 12 days for a result.
