An eight-wicket victory over Chittagong put Khulna on top of the National Cricket League stakes at the end of the third day at Rajshahi's Shaheed Kamruzzaman Stadium.

Rajshahi too won yesterday, crushing the hapless Dhaka by nine wickets while Dhaka Metropolis and Sylhet will look to push for victory today, the final day of the sixth round of games.

CHITTAGONG-KHULNA

It was Alamin Hossain who cleared the path for Khulna's smooth ride. The paceman who took a five-wicket haul in the first innings, swung back into action in the second with figures of 7 for 36 from 15 overs as Chittagong were bowled out for 144, adding just 44 on the third morning.

Khulna took 27.4 overs to get the job done, Nazmus Sadat scoring an unbeaten 55.

DHAKA-RAJSHAH

Rajshahi completed the formalities within the first hour after Dhaka declared their first innings on 131-9 as Mahbubul Alam couldn't bat due to a hand injury at the Barisal Divisional Stadium.

It meant the defending champions had to get just 49 runs to claim their fourth win with Samjul Islam winning the man-of-the-match award.

RANGPUR-DHAKA METRO

Dhaka Metro kept up the pressure after posting a massive 518 runs in the first innings. Rangpur lost three second innings wickets and are still 71 runs behind as they go into the fourth and final day at the Fatullah Cricket Stadium.

Shamsur Rahman struck 86 while Tasamul Haque also hammered 84 as Dhaka Metro added 240 runs on the day.

Abdur Rahman Rony took four wickets for 121 runs.

Aussie quicks a concern for NZ

New Zealand captain Ross Taylor has warned that, despite having a weakened bowling attack, Australia are still a serious threat going into the first Test in Brisbane.

Australia are without the services of injured trio Mitchell Johnson, Ryan Harris and Pat Cummins, but Taylor says the youthful exuberance of James Pattinson, Mitchell Starc and Ben Cummins will be a definite threat on the notoriously bouncy 'Gabella pitch after watching them bowl for Australia a last week.

"Experience-wise it is one of the weakest [Australian attacks], but they know the conditions better than we do," said Taylor.

"We've had a look at them on a flat Allan Border Field wicket, but I'm sure they'll come at us hard but we'll expect that. We're confident, we've scored runs in the last two first-class games, we just need to take that confidence out onto the wicket."

"I thought James Pattinson bowled very well, he was one of the most consistent, he bowled a good line and length, plus I'd

played with him at Victoria and watched him develop there as well. I'd never seen Starc before. Cutting bowled a lot of short balls and tried to get people with the fuller delivery. So they all bowled reasonably well on a very flat wicket."

The 27-year-old is confident his side can pull off an upset and beat their Trans-Tasman opponents in a Test for the first time since the 1992-93 season, especially as New Zealand go into the match with a more settled starting XI.

Australia, meanwhile, are yet to decide on the makeup of their bowling attack as they could choose to leave out spinner Nathan Lyon depending on the conditions come Thursday.

"That is an option for them, to play four quicks, but I'm not sure how many overs Michael Clarke wants to bowl out there if he doesn't play a spinner," added Taylor.

"The overhead conditions are the biggest part. On that wicket you'd always want to bat first, but the overhead conditions can change your mind. We'll just have to see what the weather turns up with. If there's a little cloud around you'd bat, but if there's a lot of cloud around you might change your decision."
