# Polls in 90 days not possible

EC says in initial response as LGRD ministry appoints 2 administrators for split-DCC, asks it to hold elections

STAFF CORRESPONDENT

It will not be possible for the Election Commission to hold polls to the just-split Dhaka City Corporation within 90 days as asked for by the government, Election Commissioner M Sohul Hussain said yesterday.

Briefing journalists at the commission secretariat, Sohul Hussain, however, said even if the EC started preparations now, it would not be able to hold the polls within the 90-day time frame.

Besides, the next commission may not adhere to the decision made by the existing

## BNP in its new avatar

BNP has finally thrown down the gauntlet. After months of what clearly was a skirting around the bush, the main opposition party has now made its position on the question of the 1971 war crimes trial unequivocally clear.

And it has done so at a time and in a manner that can only leave a whole lot of questions about its perceptions of the Liberation War in need of credible answers. Observe.

The party has demanded that the proceedings of the International Crimes Tribunal be put an immediate stop to because of what it believes is a violation of the rights of the accused on the part of the tribunal itself.

From the perspective of strict legality as also from its own assessment of conditions in so far as existing circumstances vis-à-vis the trials are concerned, the party can certainly raise questions about the modalities on

## Khoka held, freed

Sporadic violence marks hartal

Sporadic clashes over Sadeque Hossain Khoka's brief detention marked yesterday's daylong hartal enforced by the main opposition BNP to protest the split of Dhaka City Corporation.

Pickets clashed with law enforcers when they were barred from bringing out pro-hartal processions in several areas of the city, including Old Dhaka.

Mirza Fakhrul Islam, acting secretary general of BNP, alleged that Awami League cadres had stabbed immediate past DCC mayor Khoka in police custody after he had been detained at the District Judge's Court premises in Old Dhaka.

Police, however, said they had picked up the BNP leader for reasons of his safety, and dropped him off at his Gulshan residence.
