## Dilemma over location delays construction for months

Construction of Shishu Academy complex in the town has not started 17 months after inauguration of the Tk 9.34 crore project as the authorities have remained undecided about the location even after allotment of land for the academy.

Khagrachhari bazar fund committee on June 20, 2008 allotted about one acre of land for Shishu Academy Complex in court area of the district town, said sources at district Shishu Academy office.

Executive Committee of the National Economic Council (Ecnec) on March 2 last year approved the fund of Tk 9 crore 34 lakh 82 thousand and 518 for the project that was scheduled to start

in June 2010 and complete by June 2013.

Meanwhile, the Ministry of Law, Justice and Parliamentary Affairs on November 20, 2009 ordered the local administration to acquire land for construction of Chief Judicial Magistrate's (CJM) Court and the authorities proposed the same location for the purpose.

On August 30 last year, the district administration sent a proposal to Bazar Fund Administration to cancel the allotment of the land for Shishu Academy Complex.

The work for the project has remained hanging as the authorities are yet to take a concrete decision regarding the matter, sources said.

Chairman of

Khagrachhari Hill District Council and Administrator of Khagrachhari Bazar Fund Administration Kujandra Lal Tripura said they have no legal power to cancel the allotment of the land that was earlier decided for Shishu Academy.

District Children Affairs Officer Ushan Chowdhury said, "The construction of Shishu Academy Complex, aimed at physical, mental and cultural development of local children, has not started in 17 months. Now the project seems uncertain."

Khagrachhari Deputy Commissioner Anis-ul Haque Bhuyan said, "The place is appropriate for the CJM court as it is near the District and Sessions Judge's

## Attack on BNP man

Police and local sources said some 4/5 Jabo League men led by one Abdul Malek Mir beat up Mridha mercilessly, leaving him injured critically at about 8:00pm. Later, he was sent to the hospital. The incident occurred while Mridha was returning home from nearby Boga Bazar.

## Two cocktails recovered

Police recovered two cocktails from Ranihati area of Shibganj upazila yesterday. Mirza Abdus Salam, officer in-charge of Shibganj police station, said local people found the cocktails at a mango orchard near Ranihati High School and informed them. Later, the law enforcers seized the cocktails. However, nobody was arrested in this connection.

## 3 BCL leaders land in prison

Three BCL leaders of Sylhet city were sent to prison for assaulting police when they were produced before the court yesterday. Those sent to prison are BCL city unit vice-president Abdul Hye Al Hadi, his colleagues Abdul Hafiz and Abdul Ahad. Enamul Haq, officer-in-charge of Shah Paran PS, said he and Assistant Police Commissioner Jabedur Rahman were interrogating the litigant and accused of a women repression case on Saturday night. BCL leaders entering the PS asked the police to set free the accused. On refusal they hurled abusive at the police officers and physically assaulted an ASI and constable.

## Man held with fake dollars

Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) personnel in a drive arrested a man along with 43,800 fake dollars from a computer shop in Suihara area of the district town yesterday. The elite force also recovered paper, computer, printer and scanner for making counterfeit currencies from the possession of Imran Khan Rana, 35, son of Aslam Mia of Chhotogorgola in the town. Md Humayun Kabir, ASP of Rangpur Rab-5, said on secret information, they raided the shop and seized 438 notes of \$100, arrested Rana.

## Indian clothes seized

Members of Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) and coastguard in a joint drive arrested three people along with contraband Indian clothes worth over Tk three crore from Khanjahan Ali Bridge of the district on Saturday night. The arrestees are Idris, Monir and Anwarul. Police said on secret information, a joint team of Rab-6 and coastguard seized a covered van and arrested the trio with the clothes at about 10:30pm. The seized items included sarees, three-pieces and sweaters.

## Fugitive convict held

Police arrested a fugitive convict from Kachua village in Assasuni upazila on Saturday night. The arrestee is Tapon Kumar Das, 37, son of Nitai Chandra Das of the village. On secret information, the law enforcers arrested Tapon from his house. Tapon was absconding since the district court sentenced him to two years' imprisonment in a criminal case last year. The court also fined him Tk one thousand.

## Schoolgirl violated

A schoolgirl was violated allegedly by a teenage boy at Barapakuria village in Kamarkhanda upazila on Wednesday. The accused is son of Shahidul Haque of the village. Quoting local sources police said the boy took the girl, a Class I student of a local school to his house and violated her at around 11:00am. Hearing the hue and cry, local people rescued the victim in profusely bleeding condition and admitted her to a local hospital. However, the boy managed to flee the scene. A case was filed in this connection.

## Landless people agitate, place 8-point demand

Hundreds of landless people of the district demonstrated in the town yesterday morning to press their 8-point demand including allocation of khas land.

Earlier, the landless people, under the banner of Rangpur Zila Bhumihin Sangram Parishad, brought out a huge procession.

The processionists paraded the main roads of the town. Later they gathered at the deputy commissioner's (DC) office premises with banners and festoons.

Sarker, president and secretary of the Parishad spoke at the rally there.

At the rally, leaders of several organisations urged the government to allot khas land among the landless people immediately.

They said allocation of khas land was an election manifesto of the Grand Alliance government. They also alleged that, the government, instead of giving them khas land was trying to evict the hapless people from khas land. They warned of non-stop movement if the government failed to

meet their demands in three months.

After the rally, they submitted a memorandum to the prime minister through the deputy commissioner.

Contacted, Idris Ali told this correspondent that the landless people are worried due to the vested property bill recently okayed by the Jatiya Sangsad.

"The government must rehabilitate the affected landless people before implementing any law," he said.

## 17 shops gutted

At least 17 shops were gutted in a fire at Khagrachhari Bazar in the district town early yesterday.

Four grocery shops, three medicine stores, a diagnostic centre, four cloth shops, four godowns and some tea stalls were burnt to ashes. The extent of loss could go up to Tk 3 crore, said the affected shop owners.

Fire brigade sources said, the fire originated from an electric short circuit at a cloth shop at the bazar at around 03:00am and soon engulfed the adjacent shops.

Three fire units doused the flames with the help of local people after one hour of frantic efforts, they added.

## Youth drowns

A young man drowned while bathing in Kumar river yesterday.

Victim Tusher Ahmed, 22, son of late Jamir Uddin of Rajnagar village under Shailkupa upazila was a diploma engineer.

Officer in charge (OC) Ahsan Habib of Shailkupa police station said, at about 4:00pm on Saturday, Kabirpur went to Kumar river for bathing.

Kabir went missing after he jumped into the river. Locals rushed to the spot and tried their best to rescue him but failed. His body was recovered from the river yesterday morning.

## Classes start a week ahead of semester final

## 2 killed over land dispute

Two people were killed over land dispute at village Bonogram Dakhinpara in Santhia upazila in the district early yesterday.

The deceased were identified as Abdul Hamid, 65, son of Ariful Islam Pramanik of the village and Sadek Ali Sheikh, 38, son of Khurshid Alam Sheikh of village Razapur of the upazila.

Police said, Hamid was killed due to enmity over a piece

of disputed land while Sadek was beaten to death by a mob.

Md Robiul Hassan, officer in charge of Ataikula police station, said a gang of 18 to 20 people led by Sadek attacked the house of Hamid around 4:00am. The attackers hacked Hamid to death with sharp weapons.

Hearing the cry of the victim's family members, locals rushed to the spot and caught two of the attackers, Md Sadek Ali and his associate Md Jane Alam, and beat them up leaving Sadek dead on the spot.
