300 shanties gutted in Ctg

Rainkhola along with his followers swooped on them at around 8:00pm and forced them out of control of the public toilet that they took lease from the Dhaka City Corporation (DCC).




Edn ministry gets 2 e-Asia awards



Int'l court's judgment in March

The International Tribunal for the Law of the Sea (ITLOS) is expected to give its judgment in March next year on the dispute concerning delimitation of maritime boundary between Bangladesh and Myanmar in the Bay of Bengal.

"The judgment on the case concerning delimitation of the territorial sea, the exclusive economic zone and the continental shelf within and beyond 200 nautical miles (NM) is expected in March 2012", said Judge Shunji Yanai, newly elected President of ITLOS, while addressing the UN

General Assembly on December 6.

Yanai, in his annual speech, referred this case as the tribunal's first delimitation case, said a press release of ITLOS.

He described the two-year period from inception to judgment on the case as a "reasonable duration for a maritime delimitation case."

India and Myanmar have unlawfully cut off a significant portion of Bangladesh's maritime area in the Bay of Bengal. The two neighbours have drawn line in the Bay in such a way that they apparently sandwiched Bangladesh, sources in Dhaka said.

Having disputes with the two

countries on "natural prolongation of the continental shelf and the baseline", Bangladesh lodged objections with the UN regarding the claims of India and Myanmar on October 8,

The objection to Myanmar's claim was lodged with ITLOS headquartered in Hamburg, Germany.

In the final hearing on the case in September, Bangladesh claimed delimitation of the exclusive economic zone and the continental shelf within 200 NM (1 NM = 1.852 kilometers) and the shelf extending up to 400-460 NM southwards from the country's coastline.

Cops foil BNP rally

Police yesterday foiled a rally of the Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) that was scheduled in front of Krishi Market in the city's Mohammadpur area.

The rally was called to protest the split of Dhaka City Corporation (DCC). As BNP men gathered for the rally in the area, police intercepted them, party leaders said.

Later, the BNP men again gathered in Adabar area, but police charged batons on them and foiled the rally, they added.

Moazzam Hossain Alal, former BNP candidate in the Mohammadpur-Adabar constituency, told The Daily Star that police and the ruling party men had foiled their rally.

He said the party had earlier taken permission from police to hold the rally in front of Krishi Market, but police denied this yesterday.

Contacted, Biplab Sarkar, assistant commissioner of police of Mohammdpur zone, denied charging batons on the BNP men and foiling their rally.

RESERVED JS SEATS FOR WOMEN

EC declares five AL candidates elected

The Election Commission yesterday declared five Awami League (AL)-nominated candidates elected uncontested to the reserved seats for women in the parliament.

The new elected lawmakers are journalist AN Mahfuza Khatun known as Baby Maudud, AL's Women Affairs Secretary Fazilatunnesa Indira, acting Secretary of Mahila AL Pinu Khan, AL Chittagong unit chief Hasina Mannan, and Deputy Attorney General Fazilatunnesa Bappy.

The returning officer Mihir Sarwar Morshed declared their names uncontested after none of them withdrew their nomination papers as of Wednesday the last date for withdrawing of the nomination papers.

On Dec 1, the EC declared the nomination papers of the five candidates valid after scrutiny.

Awami League Parliamentary Board (ALPB) chaired by Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina finalised the five candidates for women's reserved seats in the parliament on November 26.

A total of 179 aspirants bought the party's nomination papers to contest for the reserved seats.

The Jatiya Sangsad passed the Fifteenth Amendment to the constitution on June 30, increasing the number of reserved seats for women from the existing 45 to 50.
