## Poacher Nabi held again, this time with tiger skin

Police yesterday arrested a poacher with skin of a tiger from Mothbaria bus stand in Mothbaria upazila of Pirojpur district.

Acting on a tip-off, they raided the bus stand when poacher Nabi Hossain, 50, was going to Dhaka with the 7-feet long tiger skin worth about Tk 1 crore at about 9:00am.

ment, police recovered about 30 bones including head and skeleton of tiger from the house of one Moslem Gazi in Babur Hat area of Shapleza union.

Earlier, Nabi Hossain was arrested with deer and crocodile heads from Bagerhat district several times and later released on bail.

Poacher Nabi is son of Motahar Hossain of Chal Rayenda village under Sharankhola upazila of Bagerhat.

He was sued at least six times for poaching, police said.

Sundarbans divisional forest officer east zone Mihir Kumar Do said the size of the skin suggests that the tiger was 5-6 years old.

Nabi Hossain is a listed poacher. He faces several cases for similar crime, he added.

Five people including Nabi Hossain and Moslem Gazi were sued with Mothbaria PS yesterday.

## BNP LEADER MURDER

# Baraigram AL again demands release of 27 party men

Awami League Baraigram upazila and Bonpara municipal units yesterday took out a procession at Bonpara Bazar and held a press conference at local AL office demanding release of 27 party men arrested on charge of killing upazila chairman and local BNP leader Sanaullah Noor Babu.

Addressing the press conference, Abdul Quddus, AL lawmaker from Baraigram-Gurudaspur constituency, said Babu was killed over intra-party feud, not by the AL men.

"Babu came under attack during a clash between two rival groups of local BNP at Bonpara Bazar on October 8 last year and Zakir Hossain, Khokan Mollah and others AL activist were trying to save him," the lawmaker claimed.

A few days before the incident, Babu lodged a general dairy (GD) with local police station, stating that Baraigram upazila BNP President Principal Ekramul Alam threatened to kill him. So, he was murdered due to intra-party rivalry, the lawmaker told the press conference.

He demanded immediate withdrawal of the case and release of all 27 AL men.

On October 8 last year, Awami League activists attacked a BNP procession at Bonpara Bazar and beat

Sanaullah Noor Babu dead. At least 30 BNP men, including the then Bonpara municipality mayor Ishaq Ali and three local journalists, were injured in the attack.

Babu's wife Mohua Noor filed a murder case with Baraigram Police Station against 27 AL men the following day.

On November 20, a Natore court rejected the bail prayers of all 27 accused in the murder case and sent them to jail.

# Punish Bakkar's killers

## Demand townspeople in C'nawabganj

Residents of Tikrampur area agitated in the town yesterday demanding arrest and punishment of the culprits who killed a local youth last month.

Hundreds of people brought out a procession from Shaheed Satu Hall premises in the morning. The processionists paraded different roads of the town and held a rally in front of deputy commissioner's (DC) office. Later, they submitted a memorandum to the superintendent of police (SP), Chapainawabganj.

At the rally, the speakers alleged that the killers of Abu Bakkar Siddique were moving freely under the nose of police.

Abu Bakkar, 35, son of late Nazrul Islam of Tikrampur in the town went missing since one Babu called him out of the house on November 19 afternoon, police and locals said.

Criminals confined Bakkar to a room at

Dhoroil village under Nachole upazila where they beat up and tortured him.

On a tip-off, police went to the village and rescued Abu Bakkar the next day. Seriously injured, he was rushed to Chapainawabganj Adhunik Sadar Hospital immediately where he died the same day.

Relatives and friends of the victim later caught Babu, 35, of Natunhat area in the town and handed him over to police.

Victim's uncle advocate Shamsul Haque filed a murder case against 48 men with Nachole police station.

We want an exemplary punishment to the killers, so that nobody dares to commit such crime again, the speakers said.

Among others, advocate Mizanur Rahman, Shahidul Huda Alok, Faizur Rahman Kanak and Arman Alispoke at the rally.

Police said, criminals killed Abu Bakkar over a disputed land. The killers are on the run, they said.

## Hill people demand repeal of 15th amendment to constitution

Gonotantik Jubo Forum, Pahari Chhatra Parishad and Hill Women's Federation jointly held a rally at Kutukchhari Bazar in Rangamati Sadar upazial on Wednesday demanding repeal of the clause concerned of the 15th amendment to the constitution.

Iterating the demand for full autonomy for the CHT region, the leaders of the associate bodies of United People's Democratic Front (UPDF) said the government had betrayed with jumma people by bringing the amendment to the constitution.

They also warned the government of tougher agitation if the clause concerned of the 15th amendment was not immediately repealed.

## HSTU teachers postpone work abstention

Teachers of Hajee Danesh Science and Technology University (HSTU) yesterday postponed the work abstention till 13 December following an assurance by the vice chancellor to resolve the crisis at the next meeting of the regent board.

The regent board meeting of the university is expected to be held on December 12, official sources said.

The 120 teachers of HSTU started work abstention for an indefinite period on Sunday last to realise two-point demand. The demands are promotion of every deserving teachers within the timeframe and immediate implementation of the order for promotion of associate professors.

Earlier on November 29, the teachers submitted a memorandum to the vice chancellor in this regard.

The teachers also alleged disparity in promoting teachers.
