Sylhet in second phase

Sylhet made it to the second phase of the National Cricket

League with a resounding eight-wicket win over Dhaka at the Fatullah Cricket Stadium yesterday.

The win took them above Chittagong who got mauled at the hands of Rangpur by 241 runs while Khulna struck up their fifth win in the competition after they beat Dhaka Metropolis by 175 runs.

SYLHET-DHAKA

Imtiaz Hossain, the Sylhet skipper, smashed an unbeaten 88 off 115 balls with the help of 13 boundaries and two sixes on the final day.

Sylhet took just over a session to complete their fourth victory in the first phase.

Mosharraf Hossain took two wickets in the second innings as Dhaka ended their woeful campaign with their sixth loss in seven outings.

CHITTAGONG-RANGPUR

The task of batting out the final day was beyond the Chittagong batsmen as they only survived for 23.5 overs at the Shaheed Chandu Stadium in Bogra.

But the wicket was excellent even on the fourth and final day as Nafees Iqbal struck his second century. He hit fourteen boundaries and a six in his 149-ball essay, but the rest simply folded.

Only Noor Hossain held up Rangpur's progress, hitting three sixes and ten fours to make a 43-ball 68 but it was never enough.

Abdur Rahman Rony took three for 68 as the northernmost division finished their campaign with two wins.

Shane Watson has suffered a setback in his bid to regain fitness in time for Australia's Test series opener against India but he is still expected to recover in time for the big clash.

Watson's fresh

Watson, already sidelined from Australia's current series against New Zealand with a hamstring injury, is still on course to play in the first of four Tests against the Indians, Australia skipper Michael Clarke said on Thursday.

"Watto has got a light calf strain. It's put him a couple of days behind but we're confident he'll be right for the Boxing Day Test," Clarke said on the eve of Australia's second and final Test against the Black Caps in Hobart.

Clarke indicated that even if Watson's recovery prevented him from bowling in the Test starting on December 26 at the Melbourne Cricket Ground, he would be chosen primarily as a batsman, if available.

"His batting is still a very big part of our team at the top of the order. He's been pretty consistent for us," Clarke said. "But in the best-case

scenario I would love him to be able to bowl as well because he's had a lot of success with the ball, especially particularly of late.

"Perfect world for us is both batting and bowling, but I think his batting is important to us."

Watson, 30, illustrated his worth as an extra seamer in the Australian attack when he captured five for 17 off 30 balls in the first innings of the Cape Town Test against South Africa last month.

All-rounder Watson has scored 2,135 runs and taken 56 wickets in 32 Tests.

Monem Munna, one of the finest footballers Bangladesh has ever produced, who died in 2005 at the age of 39, is still alive in the memories of the West Bengal people as the former Bangladesh captain who enthralled Indian spectators wearing the shirt of the East Bengal Football Club 20 years ago.

Central defender Munna became a household name in Kolkata after playing only two years (1991-1992) for the East Bengal Football Club and helped the supporter-based club win the league titles o both occasions. During that time, Abahani teammates Sheikh Mohammad Aslam and Rizvi Karim Rummy also accompanied Munna in East Bengal Football Club colours. "A footballer like Munna will not be produced

again in this sub-continent," said East Bengal Football Club official Debabroto Sarker, who is Football Federation (AIFF) when a couple of journalists visited the AIFF office yesterday.

"You people don't know how crazy the West Bengal people were for Munna and they were eager to invite them into their homes," an emotion-choked Nitu said. Nitu Sarker was surprised to see Munna's level of confidence when the East Bengal Football Club ended goalless in the firsthalf against Mohan Bagan.

"I asked him what happened today. He told me that the club would find the back of the opponents' net inside ten minutes of the second half and we left the field with a victory over Mohan Bagan," said the organiser, adding, "I watched a lot of footballers but never saw a man like Munna who had such firm belief."

Munna also wore the jersey of the East Bengal Football Club in 1998 but he could not shine as he did in 1991-1992.

Munna made his national debut in 1986 at the age of 18 in the Seoul Asian Games and under his captaincy Bangladesh achieved their first-ever international success in the four-nation Grand Royal Challenge Cup in Myanmar in 1995.

If the PCB is successful, it would herald the return of international cricket to Pakistan following the attack on Sri Lankan cricketers in Lahore in March 2009.

Talks of a possible Bangladesh tour of Pakistan could be the by-product of the deal between the PCB and BCB in choosing the next ICC vicepresident. The nomination rests with the two countries and Pakistan is reportedly ready to concede its right for an expected tour by Bangladesh in 2012.

The PCB has also been trying to revive cricketing ties with India, and Ashraf was expected to visit India this month to meet with officials from the BCCI. That meeting could now take place on the sidelines of the ACC meeting in Singapore.

According to the ICC's Future Tours Programme, Pakistan are scheduled to tour India for three Tests and five ODIs in March and April next year, but there is uncertainty over whether that series will take place. The two teams have not been involved in a bilateral series since the terrorist attacks in Mumbai in November 2008.

CA board to restructure

Cricket Australia (CA) said Thursday it would overhaul the structure of its board to give each of its six state associations equal representation in decision-making.

CA said it has accepted the recommendations of a review into its governance, which has called for its 14 directors to be replaced by a board consisting of nine members.

The organisation has also agreed that each of its six state associations will have an equal vote, moving away from the historic structure that gave different states a varying number of votes.

Clarke would bowl first

Australia captain Michael Clarke said Thursday he could be tempted to bowl first if he wins the toss on a Bellerive greentop in the second Test against New Zealand.

The bowler-friendly pitch

threatens to make life difficult for the team batting first in Hobart and Clarke said he may be forced to go against his natural instincts and bowl should the coin toss go his way. Australia lead the two-

Test series after a thumping nine-wicket victory at the Gabba in Brisbane last weekend and Clarke has named an unchanged eleven.

Clarke, who has only won the toss once in his seven Tests as captain, said overhead conditions on the morning of the match would help him decide whether to bat or bowl.

"I'll wait and see tomorrow. I think overhead conditions will play a part. For me it's more about looking up than looking down to see what

the weather is like," he said. "If the wicket doesn't change much from what I see

and it's still a little bit tacky and there's overhead conditions, there's a big chance I'll bowl first.
