Fraud alert from Libya

Govt urged to ensure proper screening as manpower cheats get active

PORIMOL PALMA

Bangladesh embassy in Libya has asked for stringent government measures so that illegal manpower syndicates cannot send jobseekers to that country.

The embassy sought such steps as it learnt that illegal syndicates have become active to send Bangladeshi workers to Egypt and Sudan with tourist visas, and then push them into Libya, official sources said.

Libya could be a very important labour market for Bangladesh. But any sort of illegal practices in sending manpower to that country might ruin the scope to utilise this opportunity, said Ahsan Kibria Siddiqui, first secretary (labour) at the Bangladesh mission in Tripoli.

The embassy therefore sought government steps to closely watch airport immigration in the country, Ahsan told The Daily Star over the phone recently.

Besides, it sought that the Bangladesh mission in Egypt request the authorities in Egypt and Sudan to check illegal entry of any Bangladeshis to Libya.

Workers block road over house rent hike

Several hundred garment workers barricaded the main thoroughfare in Chittagong for several hours yesterday after police obstructed their rally called to protest frequent rise in house rents.

Due to the blockade, traffic remained stranded on the Airport Road since 3:30pm until police high officials around 9:15pm assured the agitators of steps to meet their demands.

Earlier, workers of different factories at Chittagong Export Processing Zone (CEPZ) and adjoining areas gathered on Labour Colony ground near the CEPZ main gate around 2:30pm to join the pre-

announced rally to press home their seven-point demand that includes an end to arbitrary increase of house rents, a sub-inspector of Bandar Police Station told The Daily Star.

Law enforcers rushed in around 3:00pm and barred the workers from holding the meeting, workers alleged. Police closed the gate of the ground so that no worker could enter.

Angered, the workers took to the streets and put barricades at different points including Saltgola Crossing, Mailer Matha and Navy College Gate on the Airport Road.

Eurozone debt deal reached without UK

AFP, Brussels

European Union leaders, except Britain, banded together yesterday to back tighter budget policing after a heated summit considered a last chance to save the debt-struck eurozone.

After two years of foot-dragging on deepening integration, 26 of the 27 EU states signalled their willingness to join a "new fiscal compact" to resolve the two-year crisis threatening to crack apart the monetary union.

But the deal came with a heavy political price when non-euro Britain resisted a Franco-German drive to enshrine new budget rules in a modified EU treaty to

carve them into stone.

"The British were already not in the euro and in that respect, we are used to this situation," German Chancellor Angela Merkel said as talks resumed yesterday after a first 10-hour session winding up at 5:00am.

Merkel said she was "very pleased" most had agreed the "fiscal compact" that plans to impose near automatic sanctions on debt and deficit delinquents.

"We have learned from the mistakes of the past," she said.

The 17 eurozone nations signed up to the pact while nine other EU nations, "indicated the possibility to take part in
