FERRY SERVICES

Disrupted by dense fog

STAR REPORT

Ferry services on Paturia-Daulatdia and Mawa-Kawrakandi routes resumed yesterday morning after 10-hour-long disruption due to dense fog.

Huge traffic congestion on both sides of the routes of the Padma river kept thousands of people stranded until ferry operations resumed around 10:15am, report our Manikganj and Munshiganj correspondents.

Eight ferries had been stranded at Paturia ghat while two others in the river.

Meanwhile, the authorities at 10:00pm last night again suspended the ferry services on Mawa-Kawrakandi route due to bad visibility from the foggy weather, reports our correspondent.

Ten ferries got stuck at different points of the river causing immense sufferings to hundreds of people. State Minister for Labour and Employment Begum Monnajan Sufian also got stranded.

The suspension will continue till the situation is improved, said Asiquzzaman, assistant general manager at Mawa office of Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Authority (BIWTA).

Daulatdia and Paturia office sources of Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Corporation (BIWTC) said two Ro-Ro (roll-on/roll-off) ferries -- Keramat Ali and Amanat Shah -- had to stop in the middle of the river while Bir Shrestha Hamidur Rahman, Shah Ali, Shah Paran, Shah Jalal, Bir Shrestha Jahangir, Bir Srestha

Bangladeshi victim's body brought home

The body of Gauranga Mondol, killed in the Kolkata AMRI Hospital fire Friday, was brought to Bangladesh yesterday.

Says Mosharraf

If BNP comes to power, its first task will be unifying the divided Dhaka City Corporation, party's standing committee member Khandaker Mosharraf Hossain said yesterday.

He was addressing a rally at Badda in the capital, organised as part of BNP's five-day programme to protest the attack on immediate past DCC mayor Sadeque Hossain Khoka and to press for unifying the two city corporations.

Mosharraf alleged the government has split up the DCC at the instructions of the prime

4 credit card cheats held

Postal staff help gang steal mail, mint money

Detectives have arrested four persons, including a postman of the capital, for credit card fraud.

The arrested are Kamal Ahmed alias Nurul Amin, 52, the gang leader; Abdur Rauf, 42, a postman of Gulshan Post Office, Mohammad Russell, 34, a former student of Jahangirnagar University, and Anwar Hossain, 32.

Kamal and Russell were picked up from the capital's Malibagh early yesterday while Anwar from Chittagong and Rauf from his village home in Barisal on Friday, said Senior Assistant Commissioner Mashirul Rahman of Detective Branch of police.

Kamal has been involved in fraudulence since 1996 while Anwar is an accused in a credit card fraud case filed with New Market Police Station in 2006, said police.

All of the four were taken on a two-day remand following a court order yesterday.

The group stole credit cards with the help of employees of Gulshan Post Office, the DB official said.

Using the cards, they purchased goods from different shopping malls and sold the items at a discount, he added.

A youth was killed and another injured in a road accident in the city yesterday when a garbage van of the city corporation hit their motorcycle from behind, police said.


The deceased was identified as Abu Sayeed, 28, owner of a video games shop at Dhalkanagar, Gandaria in the capital.

Rajuk has to be reformed
Seminar asks it to focus on Dhaka's planned growth

State-owned Rajdhani Unnayan Kartripakha (Rajuk) must give up operating as a housing agency and concentrate on regulatory issues to ensure planned growth of Dhaka city, speakers told a seminar yesterday.

Asiatic Society of Bangladesh organised the day-long international seminar on urbanisation at the Cirdap auditorium which was attended by high officials and noted experts.

"Rajuk has ever been busy with plot development as if it were a housing development agency," said Suhel Ahmed Choudhury, former secretary to housing and public works.

Widespread corruption, inefficiency and incompetence have made Rajuk a non-functional body compared to the role of erstwhile Dhaka Improvement Trust, he said, adding "it should be restructured".

Responding to the allegation, Rajuk Member Sheikh Abdul Mannan said that the organisation cannot play the desired role as "it has to appease the influential quarters including politicians and high government officials", who own lucrative plots in Gulshan and Banani areas.

Prof Sarwar Jahan, president of Bangladesh Institute of Planners, suggested that instead of splitting the corporation area, there be a supreme authority to control the development works of different agencies in the city.
