

# IMF may add strings to its \$1b credit

The International Monetary Fund might ask the government to cut borrowing from banks and subsidy on energy to maintain budget discipline.

The organisation might impose these conditions on the government in the first year of the \$1 billion credit to the country, officials of the finance ministry said yesterday.

The government and the IMF resumed talks in Dhaka on December 1 over the loan after negotiations fell apart last year.

A visiting IMF delegation led by David Cowen for providing Extended Credit Facility (ECF) loan could wrap up the twoweek talks with the government tomorrow, officials said.

After holding several meetings with the finance minister, finance division and Bangladesh Bank, the IMF mission is going to tag the conditions with the loan.

The IMF's three-year extended programme is meant mainly to help Bangladesh tackle balance of payments (BoP) problems. The country's BoP is already under tremendous pressure.

Last year, the first priority for ECF loan was placing VAT and income tax laws in parliament, a finance ministry official said. However, this time the IMF is emphasising more on maintaining discipline in budget and the financial sector.
