### Worker dies in septic tank

A construction worker died while cleaning an underground septic tank at Aga Sadek Road in the capital's Bangshal yesterday.

Fire brigade personnel rescued unconscious Mir Hossain, 30, and took him to Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH), where doctors declared him dead.

Hossain's co-worker Hridoy Miah told reporters at DMCH that around noon yesterday the victim and six others were working inside the under-construction septic tank.

The victim's nephew Monir Hossain went inside the septic tank and started feeling sick. Mir Hossain went in to help him and lifted his nephew out of the tank, but he himself could not get out.

Two co-workers went inside the tank in a bid to rescue Mir Hossain but got out quickly, leaving the victim behind, as they also started feeling sick.

Fire brigade was informed and they took out Mir Hossain from inside the tank. Ruhul Amin, fire brigade divers team station officer, told The Daily Star that there

was about two feet deep

water inside the 12 feet by 20

feet septic tank.

As the small opening of the tank was closed for a few days, Ruhul Amin suspected that toxic gas formed inside which caused the death of Mir Hossain and made the others sick.

# Expectations yet to be fulfilled

He said bad people are driving out good people from politics and that's why the democracy has not been meaningful in the country as yet.

Matiur Rahman, editor of the Prothom Alo, said there are achievements in many sectors in 40 years of independence but difference between rich and poor, political conflicts and corruption have increased, and democratic process has been public to gain their supports," he added.

### Indians' attitude revealed: Fakhrul

Referring to a former Indian minister's proposal to grab Bangladeshi land, BNP acting Secretary General Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir yesterday said it helps to understand the attitude of some Indian politicians about Bangladesh.

"The country is now in deep crisis. Independence and

sovereignty is under threat. But our government is busy to solve India's problem instead of Bangladesh. Students have to come forward to protect the country," he said at a meeting of representatives of Dhaka city (south) unit Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal at a city hotel.

In an article published by an Indian newspaper, former Indian cabinet minister and Janata Party leader Subramanian Swamy suggested annex land from Bangladesh in proportion to its illegal migrants staying in India.

Earlier in the morning, Fakhrul joined a human chain programme organised by BNP, Lalbagh unit, in front of Jatiya Press Club demanding release of the party's former lawmaker Nasiruddin Pintu.

While addressing the programme, he said the government has re-established 'one-party Baksal rule' in the country under a new wrapping.

Meanwhile, Fakhrul addressed a discussion organised by Zia Smriti Sangsad to mark the Martyred Intellectuals' Day at the same venue.

He said, "The independence is now being destroyed due to the activities of the present government. We have to protect it under the leadership of Khaleda Zia."

### 3 ex-CID bosses, Huji leader appeal for discharge

Three former Criminal Investigation Department (CID) officials and a Harkatul Jihad al Islami (Huji) leader yesterday appealed to a Dhaka court to discharge them from the August 21 grenade attack case.

The petitioners are former assistant superintendents of police Munshi Atiqur Rahman and Abdur Rashid, former special police super Ruhul Amin, who also investigated the grenade attack case and Huji leader Shawkat Osman alias Sheikh Farid.

According to the prosecution, during the BNP-led fourparty alliance rule, the then CID investigators tried to mislead the probe to save the real culprits. They falsely implicated one Joj Miah and forced him to

give a confessional statement to a magistrate implicating other top listed criminals. The accused submitted the discharge petitions before the Speedy Trial Tribunal-1 when it resumed the hearing on

charge framing against 52 accused including BNP Senior Vice-chairman Tarique Rahman. Earlier on the day, the counsel for former director general of National Security Intelligence Maj Gen (retd) Rezzagul Haider Chowdhury completed his argument on a discharge petition.

With this, a total of 21 accused including Jamaat-e-Islami Secretary General Ali Ahsan Mohammad Mojaheed, former state minister for home Lutfozzaman Babar and Lt Commander (retd) Saiful Islam Duke have so far appealed to the court to be discharged from the cases.

Twenty-four people including Awami League (AL) leader Ivy Rahman were killed and around 200 others injured in the grisly grenade attack on an AL rally at Bangabandhu Avenue on August 21, 2004.

Judge Shahed Nuruddin fixed December 19 for the next hearing.
