1,000 DU students to get The Daily Star free of cost

One thousand resident students of Dhaka University will get a copy of The Daily Star each free of cost at their dormitories regularly from the first day of January next year.

The service will be provided under a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) signed between The Daily Star and Mutual Trust Bank Ltd. The Daily Star Editor and Publisher

Mahfuz Anam and Mutual Trust Bank Managing Director Anis A Khan signed the MoU at a ceremony at DU vice-chancellor's office yesterday. "We consider this initiative as an input to

the education of Dhaka University," said DU Vice-chancellor Prof AAMS Arefin Siddique, chief guest of the event.

Describing newspapers as an important source of information, he said, "Today's students will lead the country in future. So, they have to remain updated. And, I believe, this effort will help them achieve their goal."

Students in the master's level in different departments and institutes of DU have been chosen for the facility. Those who do not have the ability to subscribe to the newspaper daily were given priority, said DU officials.

As per the MoU, the service will continue for a year but both The Daily Star, the largest circulated English daily in the country, and Mutual Trust Bank officials expressed hope to extend the time in future. Provosts of different DU dormitories,

officials of the bank and the newspaper, and students' representatives were present at the programme. The Daily Star Editor Mahfuz Anam said

one of the targets of providing the service is to help students enrich their general knowledge and connect them with the world beyond their textbooks. He called on the students to make the best

use of the facility and hold group discussions over the contents of the daily.

Mutual Trust Bank Ltd MD Anis A Khan said they were happy that they could engage themselves in the initiative.

Masud Rana, an MBA student and one of those getting the service, said, "We read Bangla newspaper daily but cannot afford The Daily Star. It is indeed a great opportunity for us and we will surely be benefited much."

Apart from getting news, reading the English daily will help the students develop their efficiency in English, said Abdur Rashid, a student of sociology department.

Concluding the programme, DU VC Arefin thanked The Daily Star and Mutual Trust Bank authorities for introducing the service. He expressed hope that the service will expand in future.

NGO director found dead in city

A director of an NGO was found dead in his bedroom in the city's Green Road yesterday morning.

Police and relatives of the deceased suspected the incident as a murder but his wife termed it a natural death.

The body of Abul Kashem, 52, who worked for Resource Development Foundation (RDF) was recovered from the first floor of

Suvastu Tower around 10:30am. Enamul Haque, OC of Kalabagan Police Station, told The Daily Star that he found a

scratch mark on the victim's neck. Police picked up Kashem's wife Fatema Kausar alias Lazu, their son Towfique Evan

and one of Evan's friends for interrogation. Lazu told The Daily Star at the police station that her husband felt ill around 3:30am

and was sweating profusely. Lazu said she took him to the bathroom where Kashem fell on the floor and his head was hit by a bucket. She said she poured water on his head.

As he felt a little better she took him back to the bedroom and slept around 4:00am. When Lazu rose around 6:30am she found her husband dead, she claimed.

Evan, a student of a private university, told police that he and his friend slept in a separate room. Hearing his mother's cry in the morning, they went to his parent's room and found his father dead.

Kashem's nephew Abdul Mannan alleged that his aunt had an extra marital affair with the tutor of Evan. The couple had long been quarreling over the matter. He suspected that his aunt Lazu strangled his uncle.


The body was sent to Dhaka Medical College morgue for autopsy.


