



Toll booth vandalised

One lessee points at AL lawmaker, upazila chairman; MP denies, tells of locals' outburst against 'extortion'

Over 300 people, allegedly backed by the local lawmaker and upazila chairman, yesterday blocked the First Bangladesh-China Friendship Bridge and burnt down two toll booths following an altercation over realising toll at the city's Postagola in Shyampur area.

The blockade suspended vehicular movement on Dhaka-Mawa highway for over one and a half hours from 9:30am creating heavy gridlock on the busy road, said

Nuruddin Tawfiqul Islam, one of the three lessees of the bridge, alleged that a driver of a Dhaka-bound car locked in a heated argument with the toll collectors at the Keraniganj end of the bridge around 9:00pm on Wednesday.

The driver hurled insults at the toll collectors and claimed that the car belongs to ruling party MP Nasrul Hamid Bipu (Dhaka-3).

He then dialled a number and gave his mobile phone SEE PAGE 19 COL 1
