### 4 bombs go off as BNP enforces hartal in Jessore

Four bombs went off at a market in Sarsha upazila yesterday during the daylong hartal enforced in the district by local BNP, protesting the killing of Jhikorgachha upazila unit president in Gazipur.

No damage or casualty was reported in the blasts at Navaron Bazar around 1:30pm, Sarsha upazila BNP president Khairuzzaman Madhu said. Police could not say who exploded the bombs.

However, a BNP man was injured when the activists allegedly of ruling Awami League swooped on the protesters with sticks at about 12:30pm at Syamlagachhi in the upazila.

Laltu Hossain was admitted to Navaron Hospital with serious head injury.

"Some activists of Awami League attacked our supporters when they were holding a peaceful proces-

sion in the area," said Madhu.

Witnesses said, the pickets also vandalised a truck in Benapole.

Jessore BNP called the dawn-to-dusk hartal protesting the killing of Nazmul Islam, 42, finance secretary of district BNP and president of Jhikorgachha upazila BNP. He was found dead near Salna Bridge in Gazipur on Thursday night, a day after he was abducted by unknown criminals.

No long distance buses entered or left the district since 6:00am. Most vehicles -- except for a few motorbikes and rickshaws -- were off the streets during the hartal.

All the shops, business establishments and educational institutions remained closed on the day.

Nazmul was laid to rest at his family graveyard in Jhikorgachha Friday evening where BNP leaders including its central committee member Torikul Islam were present.

# 1 killed, 25 hurt as rival groups clash in Narail

50 houses, 25 shops vandalised

One person was killed and 25 others were injured in a fierce clash between two rival groups at Mirzapur village in Narail Sadar upazila on Friday evening.

The deceased is Omar Faruq, 40, son of Afzal Sheikh of the village. At least 50 houses and 25 shops at Mirzapur Bazar were ransacked while 50 cattle looted during the clash that continued for two hours from 6:00pm.

Locals said a rivalry between Bisali union parishad (UP) chairman Emarul Gazi, also hails from Mirzapur village, and Anis Sheikh, son of late Sheikh Kobad of the village, surfaced over the election in the union held in June this year. Emarul Gazi won the election, defeating his rival candidate Anis Sheikh.

Friday's clash ensued after a supporter of Gazi beat up a man of Anis and ransacked his shop at Mirzapur Bazar at around 5:00pm.

Hearing the news, Anis' men equipped with lethal weapons attacked the houses of their

rivals, prompting them to retaliate. At least 25 people from both sides were injured in the clash.

Critically injured Omar Faruq, a supporter of Anis Sheikh, succumbed to his injuries on

way to Khulna Medical College and Hospital. On information, police from Narail Sadar Police station reached the spot at around 8:00pm, dispersed the clashing group and took control of the village.

Fifteen of the injured were first admitted to Noapara heath complex and then shifted to Khulna Medical College Hospital as their condition deteriorated.

They are Lalu Kazi, Niamul Sheikh, Alamgir, Sumon, Sohan Sheikh, Ali, Hosain Sheikh, Anju Sheikh, Mohabbat Sheikh, Samim Sheikh,

Parvez Sheikh, Dulal Sheikh, Amir Sheikh, Nazim Molla and Samirul Gazi.

No case in connection with incident was lodged with the police station concerned as of 5:00pm yesterday.

### Outlaw hacked to death

A 'regional leader' of a faction of Purbo Banglar Communist Party (PBCP) was hacked to death at Hadal Beel in Faridpur upazila early yesterday.

The deceased, Motaleb Hossain alias Choita, 35, was one of the most wanted criminals on police list. He was accused in several cases, said police.

Md Abdul Hamid, officer in-charge of Faridpur police station, said on information, they recovered Motaleb's body from the water body yesterday morning at about 11:30am.

The body was sent to Pabna Medical College Hospital morgue for autopsy.

Motaleb might have been killed by rivals at midnight and the body was dumped there, the OC added.
